Barbara Blouch —becomes physician's assistant

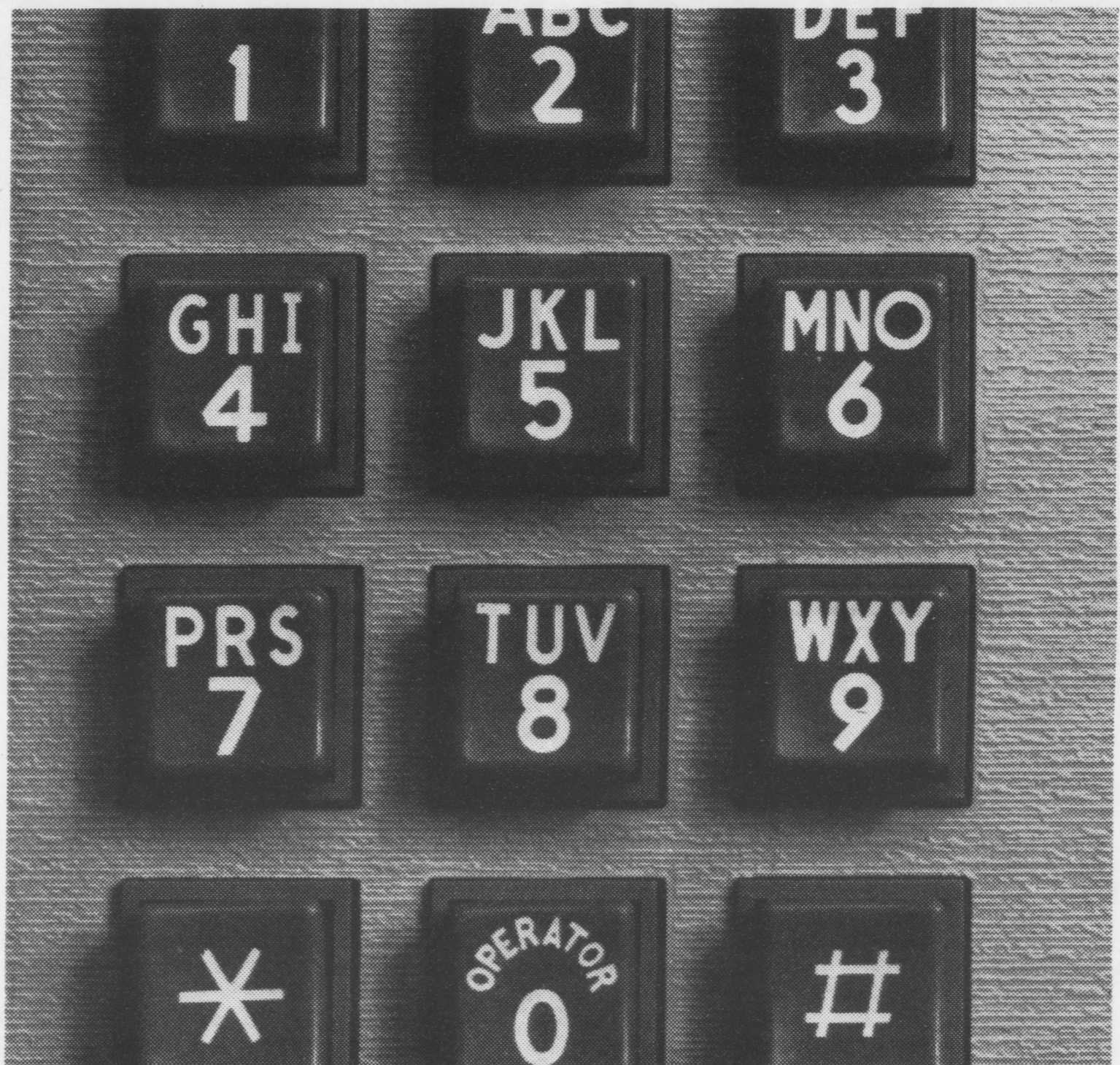
Barbara Blouch, Marian Avenue, Mount Joy, received a certificate at graduation ceremonies for the fifth class of the Primary Care Physician's Assistant Program, Friday, May 27 at 2 p.m., at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center of the PA State University.

The new physician's assistant has completed a 15-month educational program which included five months of classroom and clinical instruction at the

Medical Center and 10 months of training with physician preceptors.

The physician's assistant is trained to take patient histories, perform physical exams, assist in laboratory studies, give injections, suture wounds and perform other procedures, thus allowing the physician to concentrate on more sophisticated diagnosis and treatment needs.

Ms. Blouch's preceptor is R. Clair Weaver, M.D., R.D. #1, Elizabethtown.

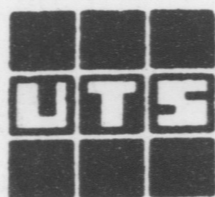


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
