Prizes were awarded for the following:

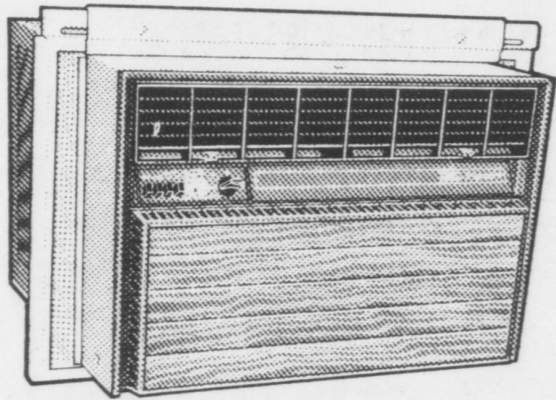
Person in an honored class coming the greatest distance—Ellen Schock Rothscheaffer; Person com-
