

[continued from page 1] cane-using blind friends on races "downtown"

Mr. Hemmig flew to Hollywood, Ca., for his first dog. A man from the training school met him at the airport and told him that he wouldn't meet his dog for several days. "We have to check you out first." the man said.

During the next few days the trainer walked all over Hollywood with him, deliberately trying to mis-lead and anger him. When Mr. Hemmig didn't lose his temper, he was judged suitable for a dog.

The dogs at this Hollywood school are all purebred female German Shepherds, trained for six months. After Mr. Hemmig and the dog got aquainted, they were tested together on an obstacle course. Besides ordinary holes, curbs, and wire strung at human head height, the two had to pass between two bonfires set three feet apart.

After the obstacle course, Mr. Hemmig and his dog were tested at an airport, on busses, and in a factory full of obstacles and welding gear. Failure meant another week of practice.

Guide dogs are trained to deal with traffic by refusing to walk on the right side of a road. They always pass a barrier on their side, not the person's. In an emergency, they will lead their masters out of a building if they are told, "Take me

Mr. Hemmig told the kids that, today, most dogs are attack-trained. The dog will attack when it hears a certain German word. If someone should strike its master, it will growl a warning and seize the attacker's wrist in its mouth without biting. If the blow is repeated, it will

Mr. Hemmig also spoke on the special harness, which is adjusted to the height of the person. The

person must follow the dog by exactly half a step if the team is to function effec-

Mr. Hemmig answered questions after his talk. He explained how he arranges food on his plate (with potatoes at 9:00), how he boards the right bus (Kona recognises the driver), and how he tells time (he passed around his Braille watch, with raised dots to indicate the hours).

When he was asked whether it was worse to be blind or deaf, he judged it worse to be blind. "But the worst of all would be confinement to a wheelchair," he said.

After Mr. Hemmig's talk, Mrs. Knorr, the school nurse, announced the winner of the Poster Contest, and Robert V. Cresswell presented the awards. The winners were:
