County buys 84 acres on Chickies

-pays 299,000 dollars

Last Thursday, Lancaster County purchased 84 acres of land on Chickies hill. The land is intended for months ago.


One tract of 21.5 acres will be sold by the county, as it is not in the park area. The other tracts adjoin the Lancaster Conservancy's land, which is to be part of the park. Other land in the area is still in the hands of private individuals or utilities.

The county paid \$299,000 altogether, thus paying \$3,559 per acre. The County Commissioners have no plans to develop the land immediately.

The newly purchased area consists mostly of farmland. It is unlikely, however, that a farmer the Chickies Park which could have bought the land was decreed several at that price for the purpose of raising crops; the investment would have been too costly.

The County Commissioners are hoping to get up to 50% of the cost back from the Federal Government. They have yet to apply (a preliminary application was made last fall).

The land was bought at a public auction by County Solicitor John Rengier, accompanied by two Commissioners. Auctioneer was Harold Keller.
