

cations are necessary, only diet control.

It takes two people to treat high blood pressure ... you and your doctor. Your role is a very important one. If you have high blood pressure, follow your doctor's advice about diet and medication. Take your medicine regularly, and get plenty of rest and recreation. If you have questions ask your doctor. The American Heart

Association reminds you that effective control of blood pressure can reduce your risk of heart attack
