

Basketball camp

The Lancaster Area Basketball camp will be held at Donegal High School between June 20th and July 1st. The camp is intended to improve basketball skills, develop team attitudes, and bring together the top players in the County.

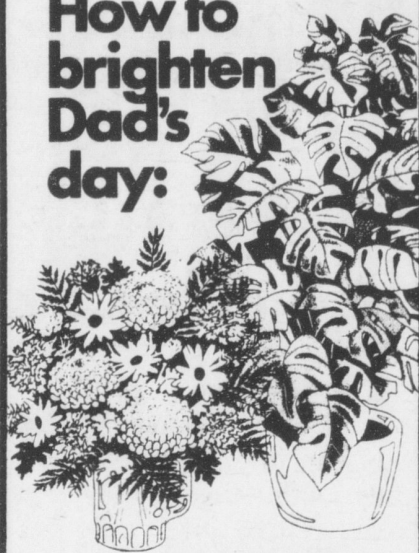
The Student Council sponsored two volleyball marathons and a St. Valen-




