# Julio Morales is state special olympics champ

The Area Special Olympics were held on May 7 at Manheim Township High School.

Mark Shope, Julio Morales, Dulio Hernandez and Jeff Girard represented Donegal and competed against students from Intermediate Units 12, 13, 14 and 15. Over 500 students participated in the meet.

The four boys gave Donegal a first in the 440 relay. Individual honors were:

Mark Shope (16 and older division)—1st high jump; Julio Morales (16 and older division)—1st mile run, 2nd softball throw; Dulio Hernandez

(14-15 division)— 1st 50 yd. dash, 2nd high jump, 2nd softball throw; and Jeff Girard (14-15 division)—3rd 220 yd. dash, 3rd high jump.

In this meet, Dulio and Julio qualified for the state meet.

Elementary students participating were Gary Wilkinson and Serna Wilt. Gary placed 2nd in the 220 yd. dash while Serna placed 1st in the 220 and 1st in the 50 yd. dash. Tony Barrett was in attendance but was unable to participate due to an illness.

The State Special Olympics were held on May 24, 25 and 26 at Edinboro State College.

Julio Morales became Donegal's first state champion in Special Olympic Competition as he was victorious in the mile run. He also captured medals by placing 2nd in the 50 yd. dash and 2nd in the softball throw (16 and older division).

Dulio Hernandez brought nome three medals in his age division. He placed 2nd in the 50 yd. dash, 2nd in the softball throw and 4th in the high jump.

The teachers involved in training and supervision were Kermit M. Norris Hazel Weigard, Deborah Ault and Gayne Deshler.
