Homemaker Program hours

The Homemaker Program of the Visiting Nurse Home Care Association of Lancaster County will operate under expanded hours of daily and weekend service, Robert C. Aims, Project Director, announced today.

The new service hours, effective immediately, will be 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. The change represents the addition of evening and weekend service for the first time.

Homemakers provide personal care and help with light housekeeping for individuals who are disabled, ill or incapacitated as a result of old age, and who live at home. They are trained by the Visiting Nurse Home Care Association and receive ongoing supervision by a registered nurse.

Expanded hours were prompted by increasing requests to the agency from physicians, social agencies and nursing homes experiencing an increased demand for home care services, Aims said. He added that the Lancaster County Office of Aging, which currently funds

Homemaker service to persons age 60 and over, also will pay for the expanded hours to these persons.
