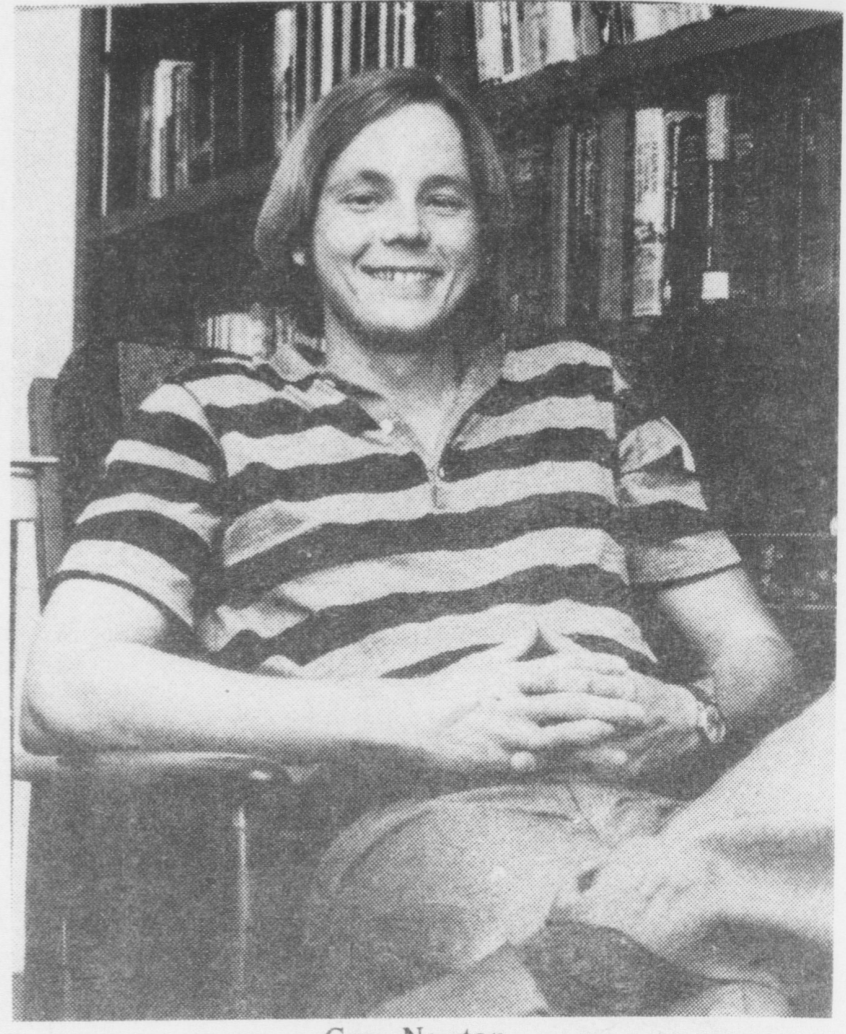

Gary Newton is new youth pastor

"Jesus Christ is the answer to people's needs; but we as a church must demonstrate in a down-to-earth way how Jesus Christ can meet those needs," says Gary Newton.
 Gary is the new assistant pastor at the Congregational Bible Church in Marietta—his official title is Pastor of Christian Education and Youth—and he's been here three weeks now. As the name implies, his major duties will involve working with young people.
 Gary comes to Marietta by way of Halifax, Nova Scotia (his birthplace), London, Toronto, New York City, Cleveland, and Chicago, this long list results from the fact that his father is a much-transferred businessman. Most recently he spent two years as a dorm counselor at Houghton College in New York. Gary got his B.A. in Psychology and Christian Education at Houghton, then got an M.A. from Trinity Seminary in Chicago.
 Gary's wife Joy, 24, whom he met at Houghton, will be assisting him in his work here. She hopes to attend Millersville State for a Masters in counseling.
 Gary will be spending a lot of time at the church Youth Center on Front Street. He also is involved in directing the summer camp in Honeybrook, PA. Next year, Gary would like to have an all-summer-long program for local youth.
 "My goal is to develop a more creative ministry to the needs of young people in the community," he says.
 Gary finds the people in our area "very friendly," and likes the country. "I think we'll probably stay here for a good while," he told us.
 Gary told us that he will be available to counsel any young person in the area.

Health Center to open soon

The Donegal-Conoy Family Health Center, located on Route 441 and Bank Street in Marietta, is expected to be completed in early August and open shortly after.
 The 4,000 square foot medical facility is owned and operated by St. Joseph Hospital and Health Care Center.
 It grew out of the former practice of Dr. Michael Gratch of Maytown and has been operating as the Marietta-Maytown Family Health Center in his former office.
 Funds for construction were provided by St. Joseph Hospital and a significant portion of personnel and daily operating expenses are covered through a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. St. Joseph Hospital is one of approximately thirty projects in the United States qualifying for this grant.
 The office will be staffed by a full time physician, Dr. Richard Charles, who recently completed his training at the Harrisburg Hospital.
 In addition to Dr. Charles, a group of family practice physicians will offer pre-natal services each Monday afternoon.
 Regular daily hours will be maintained, including evening hours several days per week.
 An open house and dedication ceremony are being planned and will be held shortly after the opening of the Center.
