Pig and Rabbit Club meets

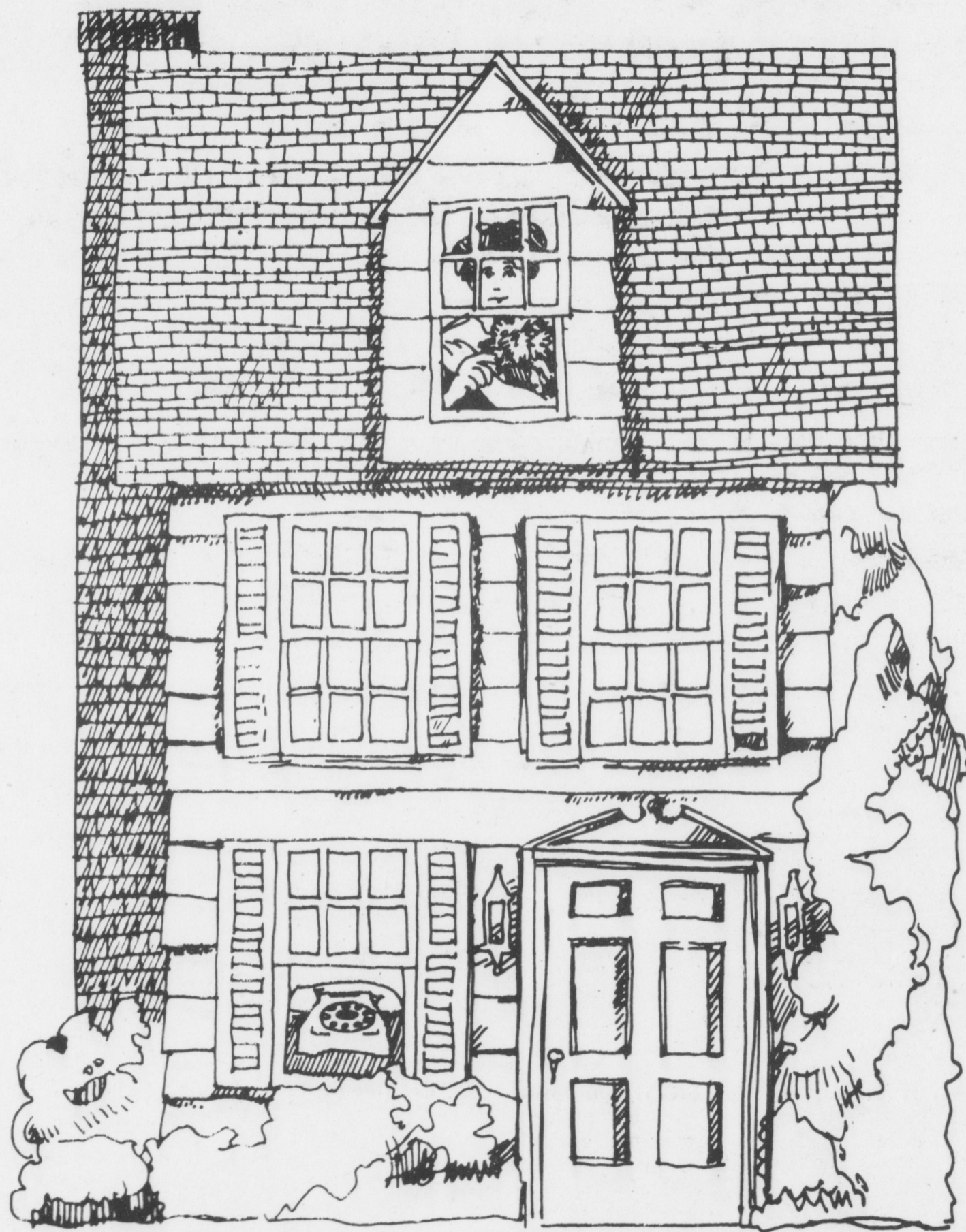

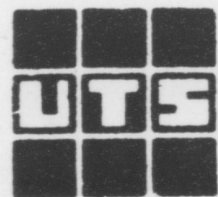
We are going to have a club picnic on August 16th, at E-Town.
