# Marietta Borough Council meets

At the last meeting, Council approved revised plans for the development of 25 apartments and 25 townhouses on two and a half acres of land near the intersection of Clay and Market Streets. All of the one-bedroom units will be built around the existing trees. The new plans have been approved by both the Marietta and County planning commissions. The developer will be Jon Schlosser of York.

Councilmen Ken Ross, Dave White, and Oliver Overlander are forming a committee within Council to apply for funds from the Lancaster-Lebanon Manpower Consortium. If the funds come through, they would be used for some of the following: formulating a comprehensive plan for Marietta; planting trees; fixing up the old town hall museum; buying a lot for park space; or repairing the baseball field at Memorial Park.

An ordinance, #77, was approved which prohibits unleashed dogs, the use of alcohol, and the defacing of property in Borough parks. The new ordinance also restricts bicycle use to certain areas and permits fires only in available fireplaces.

\$1000 was allocated for work on the curbs at Gay Street and Longenecker Avenue. \$200 was set aside for supplies to repaint the museum.

A committee of Front Street residents has been formed to confer with the Street Committee prior to resurfacing Front Street. The local representatives are Jack Frey, Mary Detz, Jack and Joanne Shaub, Jerry Martin, and Kitty Shank.

The inclusion of the Marietta Ambulance personnel in the Borough insurance policy will be considered.

It was decided to hold the November meeting on the 1st of the month so as not to conflict with the elections.

A representative of the Lancaster YMCA told the group about programs available to township residents, which would depend on the construction of facilities.

Zoning Officer Tom Lavin submitted the total value of buildings permitted since May 5th. The sum, of both new buildings and renovations, is worth \$148,130.00. Mr. Lavin also reported that four variance hearings are pending.

It was brought out that, since parking meter fees were raised when the new meter heads were installed last February, income from the devices has gone up by 100 percent over the same period last year. Since March, \$1449 in change has been stuffed into the slots, while last year only \$691 came in.
