Why your tube is fuzzy

Many viewers of WITF-TV, Channel 33, may experience reception difficulties beginning Monday, August 15, and continuing through September 18, as the station replaces its thirteen-year-old transmitter and broadcast tower on Blue Mountain, north of Harrisburg.

Reduced power will mean a sub-standard signal or, perhaps, no receivable signal at all.

August 15 until about September 6 will be the period of lowest power. Generally speaking, during this phase only those who can actually see the WITF-

TV antenna on Blue Mountain and live no more than about fifteen miles from it, or those who are cable television subscribers, can expect to receive a usable signal. September 6 until September 19 the signal should improve. The new equipment begins operating on September 19.
