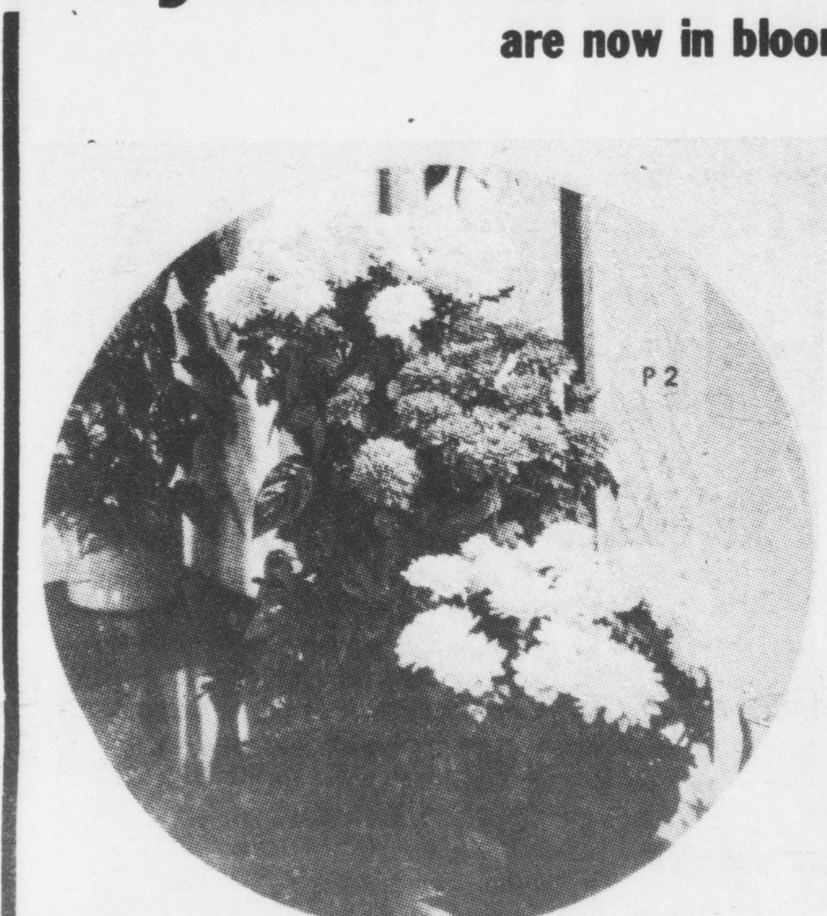
The open house will offer a door prize to some lucky person: a complete diagnostic screening, consisting of more than a dozen tests plus a computerized health history.

The Girl Scouts were originally called "Girl Guides," being so named

by Sir Robert Baden-Powell, who founded the organization in 1909, shortly after he founded the Boy Scouts. Girls are still "Guides" rather than "Scouts" in England.

The first American Girl Scout troop was formed in Savannah, GA, in 1912 by Juliette Low, who had

met Baden-Powell in Scotland. By 1920 there were troops all over the country. The Brownies got their start about the same time.

As everyone knows, Boy Scouts are loyal, helpful, trustworthy, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, reverent, and clean. Girl Scouts also have their own laws, which are primarily the same, though expressed differently. For instance, a Boy Scout is trustworthy, while a Girl Scout's honor is to be trusted. Boy Scouts are merely clean, but Girl Scouts must be clean in thought, word, and deed.

Girl Scouts are not required to be either brave or reverent.

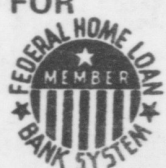
