the ages of 3 and 5) are invited to come and listen.

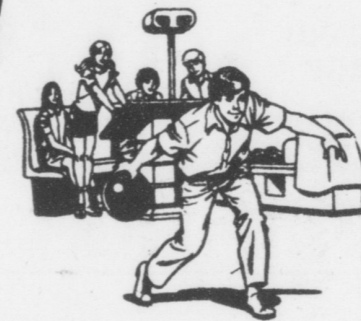
