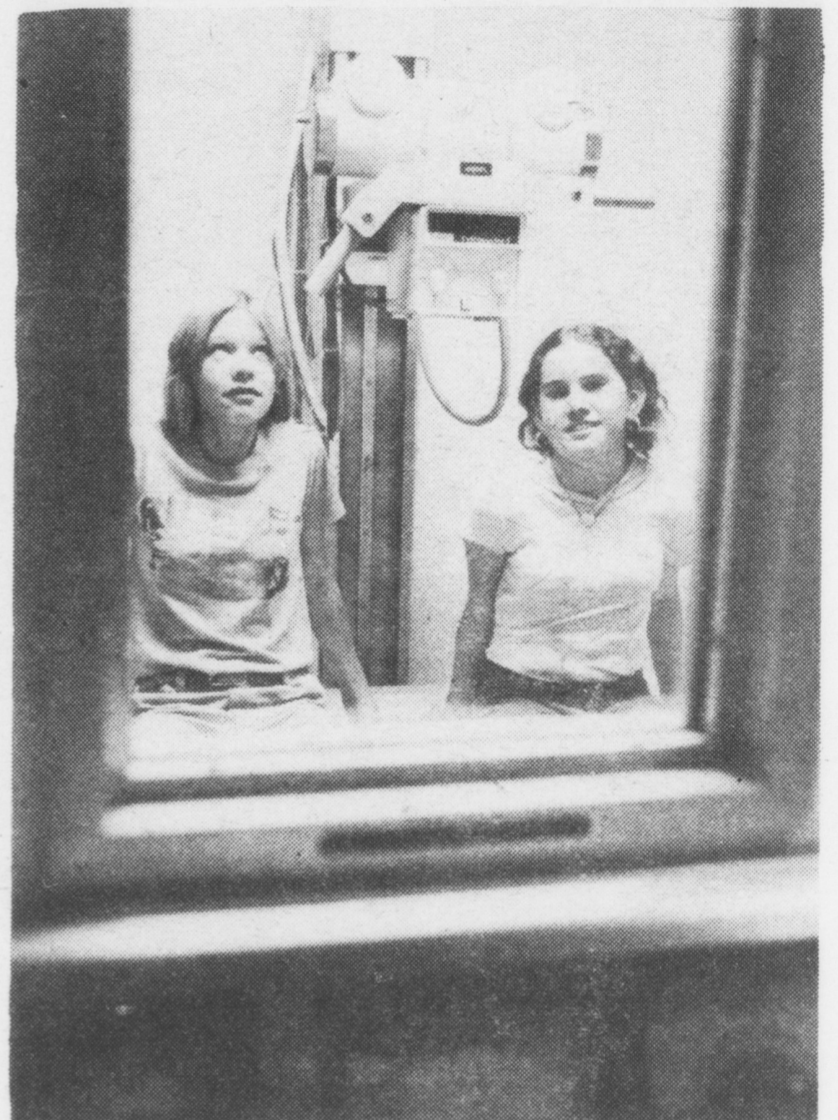

Girl Scout troop 24 of Maytown will hold a bake sale at the Maytown square on Saturday, Sept. 24th, from 8:30 to whenever it ends.

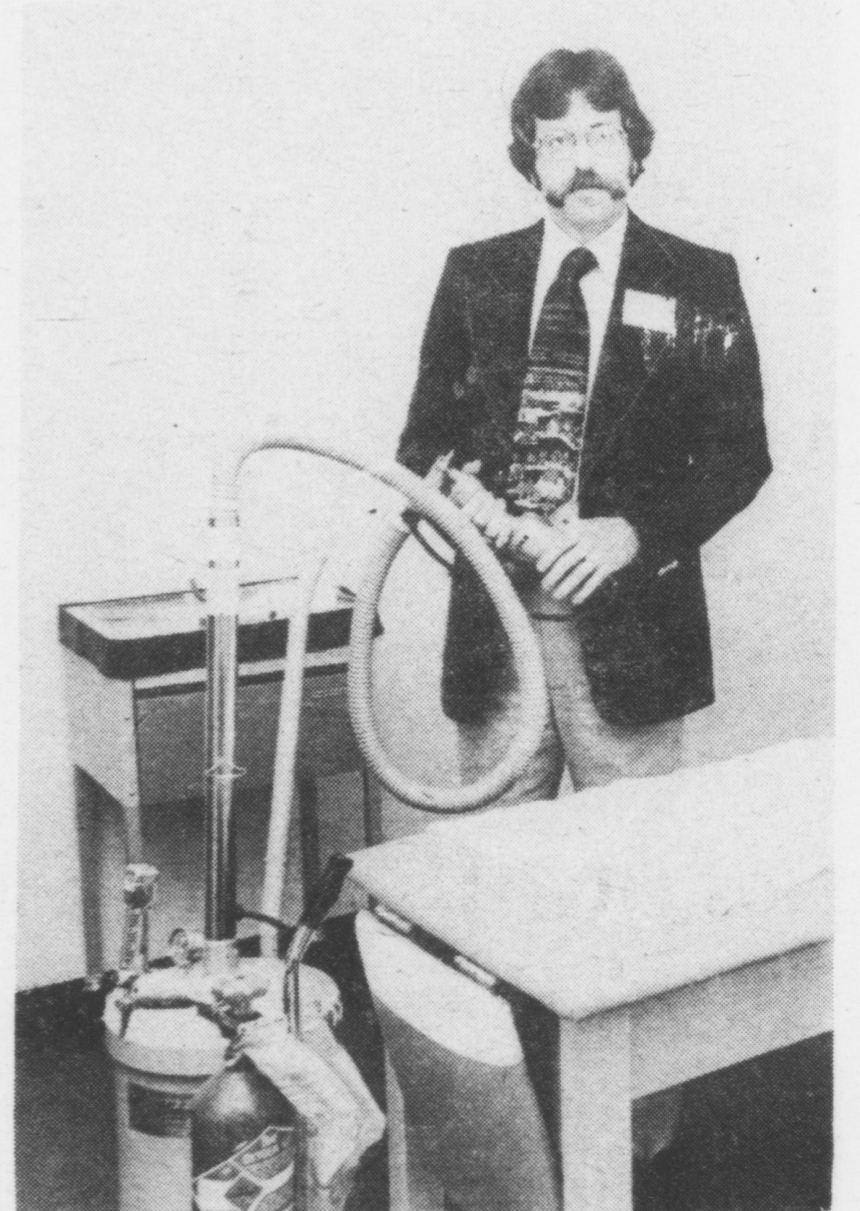
The money will be used for the girls' weekend camping at Gi-Sco-Ha, Hanover, between September 30 and October 2.
