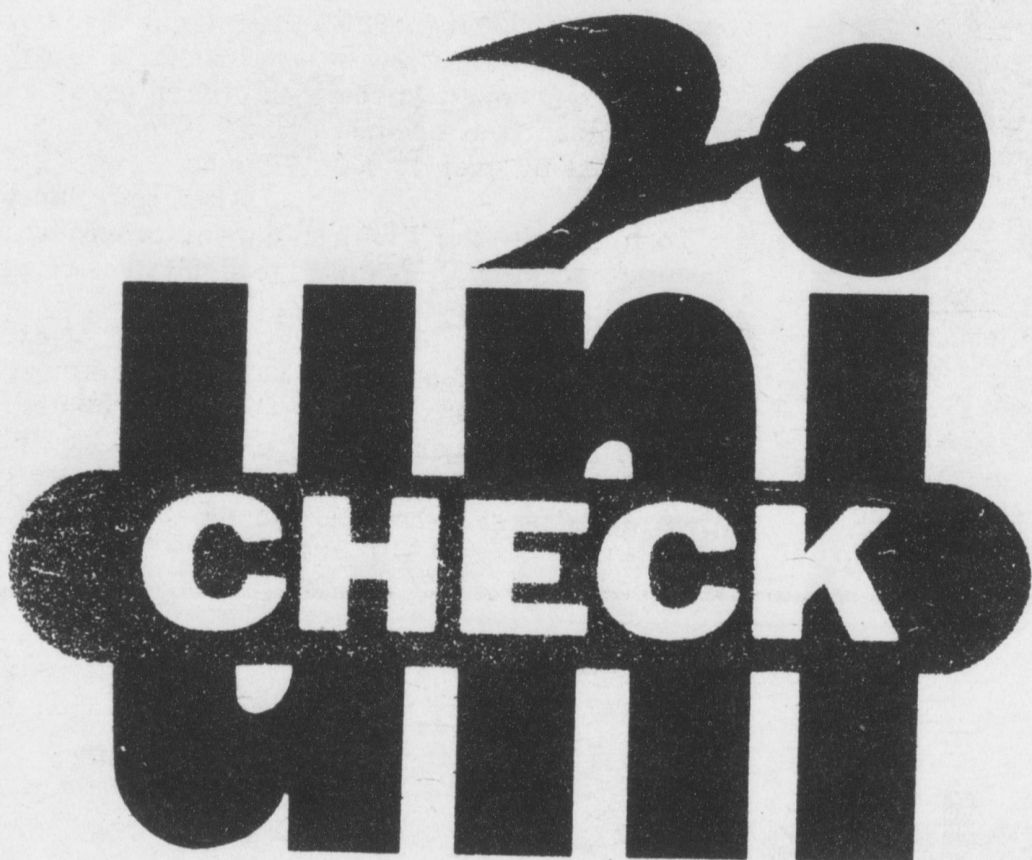


Introducing a new service
