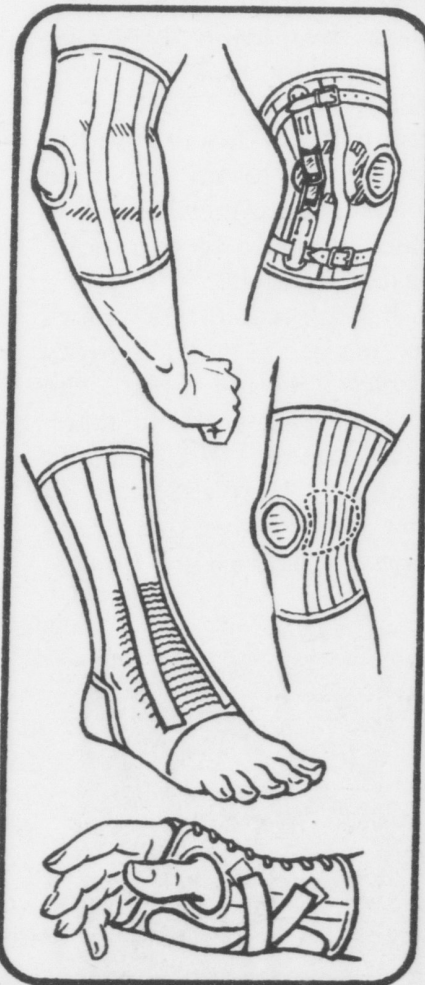

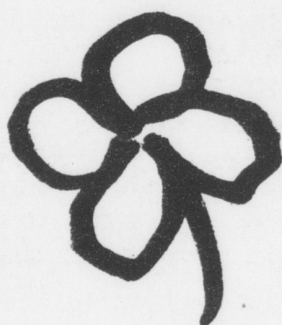
HAWK missile
