Senior Jobs program agency positions available

The Senior Employment Program of the Lancaster County Office of Aging has been in existence for over one month providing meaningful employment to many senior citizens in community-based agencies.

There are still a variety of part-time positions available throughout the city and county, including clerical, teachers aides, health assistants, etc.

Applications are being taken every Tuesday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Bureau of Employment Security, 225 N. Lime Street, Lancaster, by Office of Aging staff.

Beginning November 1, Office of Aging staff will be available in the following county locations to take applications from interested senior citizens.

Elizabethtown Area: Wednesday, November 2, - CAP Office, 32 1/2 East High Street, Elizabethtown, PA, 9 a.m. - 12 noon.

Mount Joy Area: Wednesday, November 9, 1 to 4 p.m. - Schock Senior Center, 37 E. Main Street, Mount Joy, PA.

Income eligibility requirements for the program vary. Senior citizens, age 55-59, may have income as high as \$247/month for a one-person family and \$327/month for a two-person family. Those senior citizens, age 60 and over, may have income as high as \$546/month for a one-person family and \$714/month for a two-person family.
