More than 100 schools will have representatives there, and brochures and catalogues will be passed out.

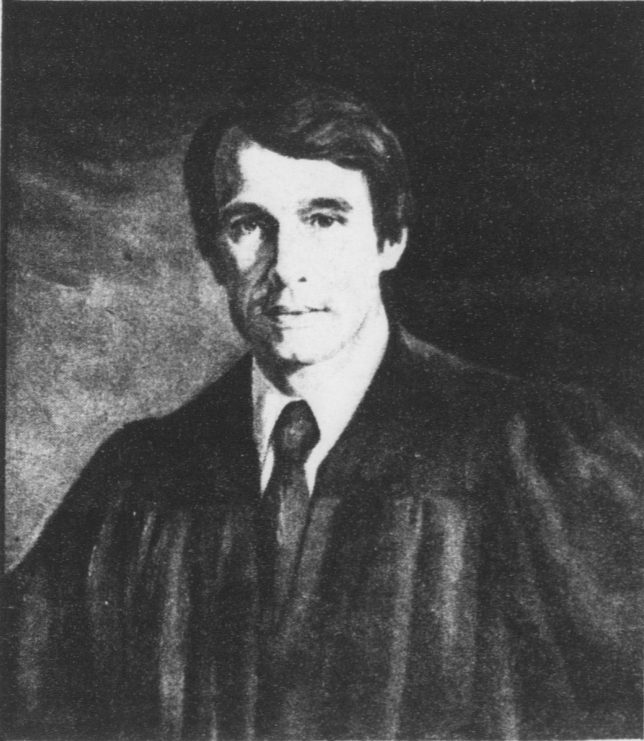
Financial aid session will take place between 7:00 and 9:30 PM.
