64 EAST MAIN STREET MOUNT JOY Mount Joy Borough Council last Monday tentatively approved a budget calling for a 4 mil tax hike. If the budget is approved at the next meeting, the rate will go from the current 13 mils to 17 mils next year.

The total 1977 budget was \$320,900. The proposed sum for '78 is \$405,899.

Emmy Lou Foley was appointed tax collector to fill the position recently vacated by resignation.



The Council gave preliminary approval to the subdivision plan of Jones and Zink, who hope to build 22 detached and 80 semi detached single family houses to be called Pennsbury Manor, on South Market Avenue between Wood Street and Donegal Springs Road.

The plans must be approved by both the Mount Joy and Lancaster County Planning Commissions before construction can begin. The Lancaster Commission has a three page document stating conditions they feel must be met. Also, an old court suit between the Borough and Jones and Zink must be resolved.

The Borough is checking with PP&L about street lighting for the area.

A subdivision of twelve homes, submitted by Harold Bernard, was postponed 30 days pending a check into the adequacy of the water supply in Florin Heights, where the new homes would be located (on N. Engle Street between Hill Street and Terrace Avenue).
