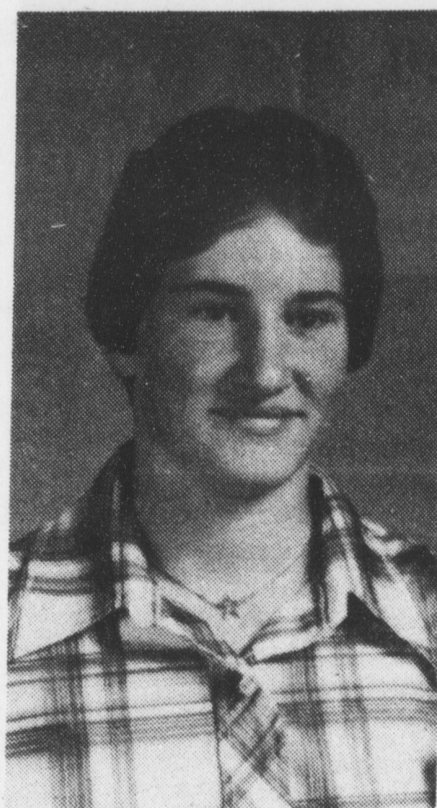

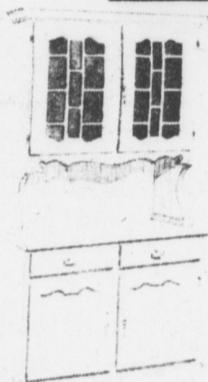
The concise yet complete 19-page tome is broken up

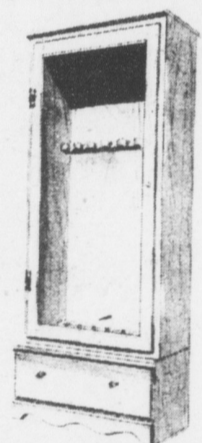

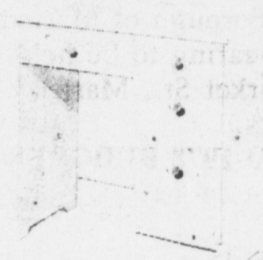

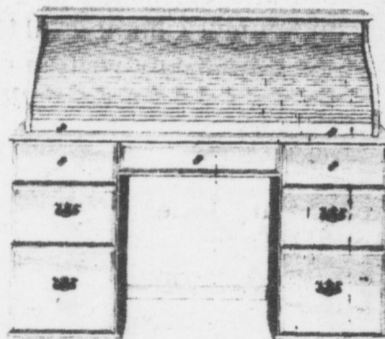
