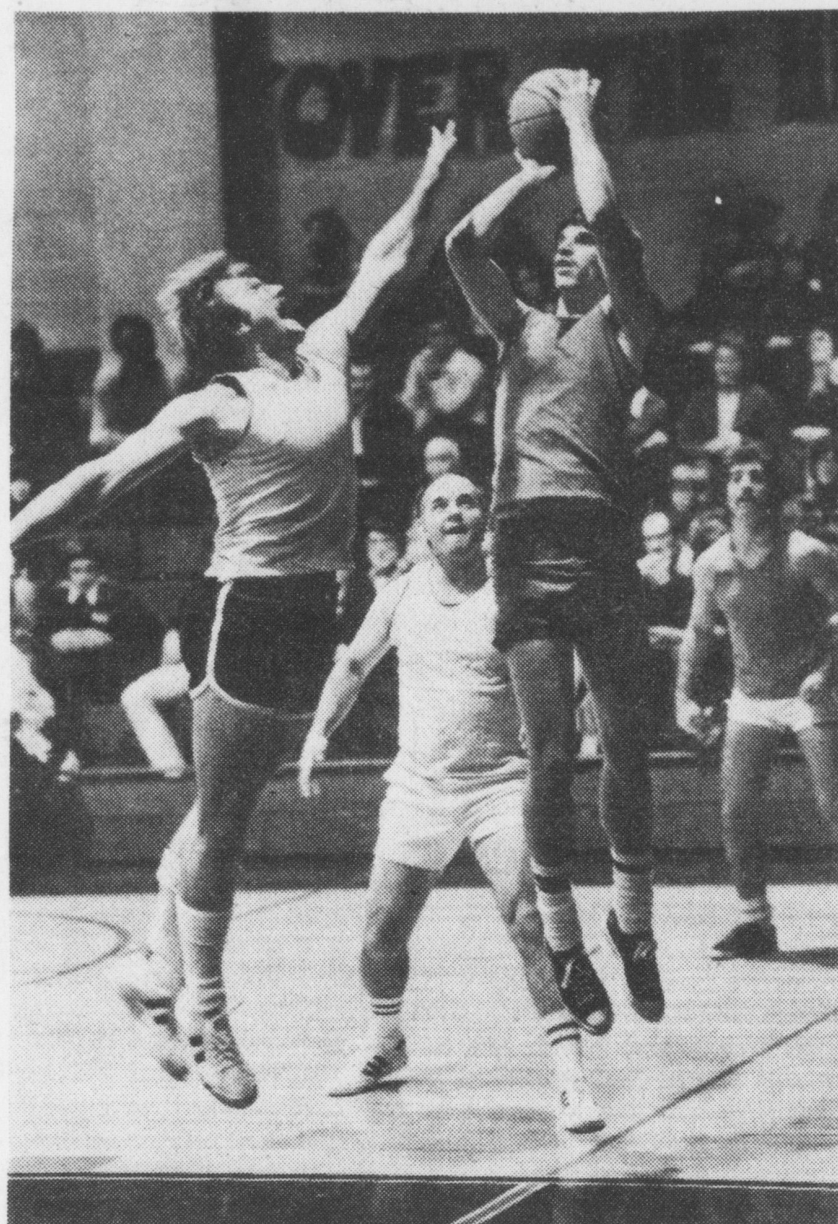

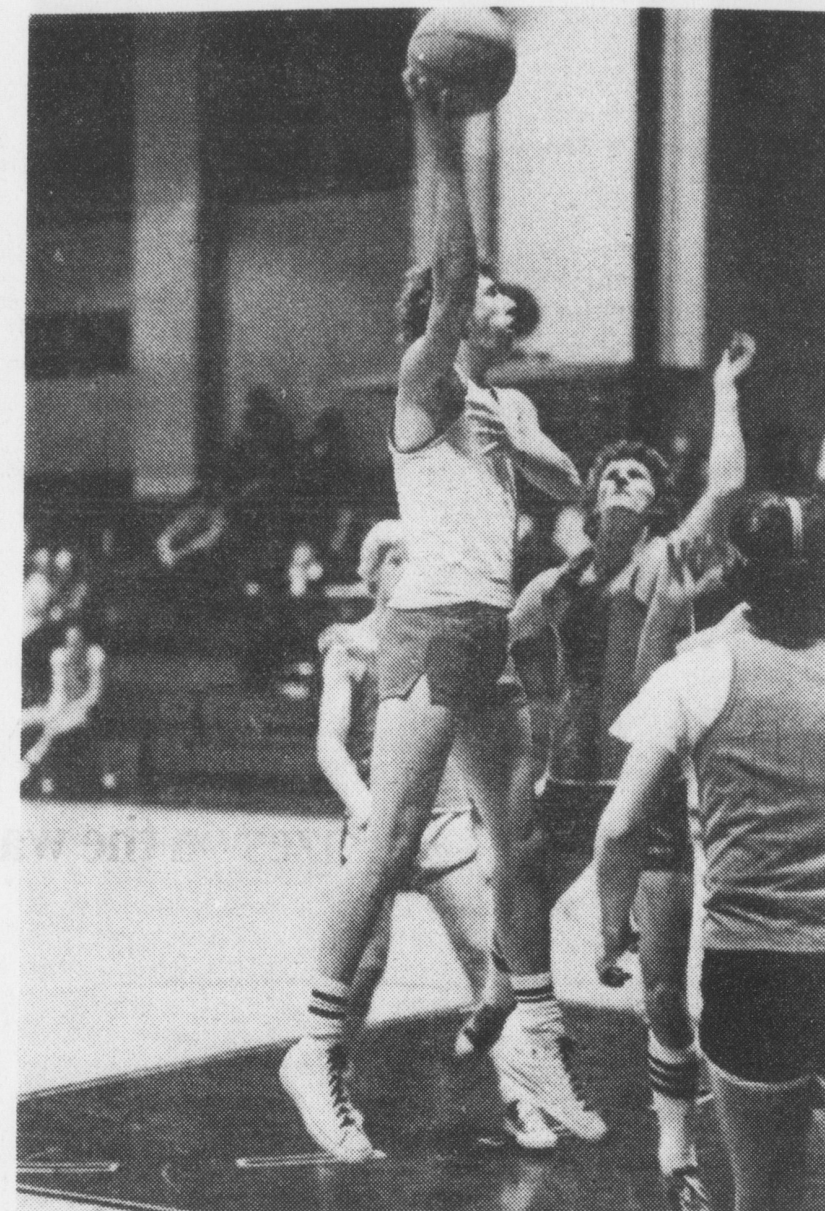

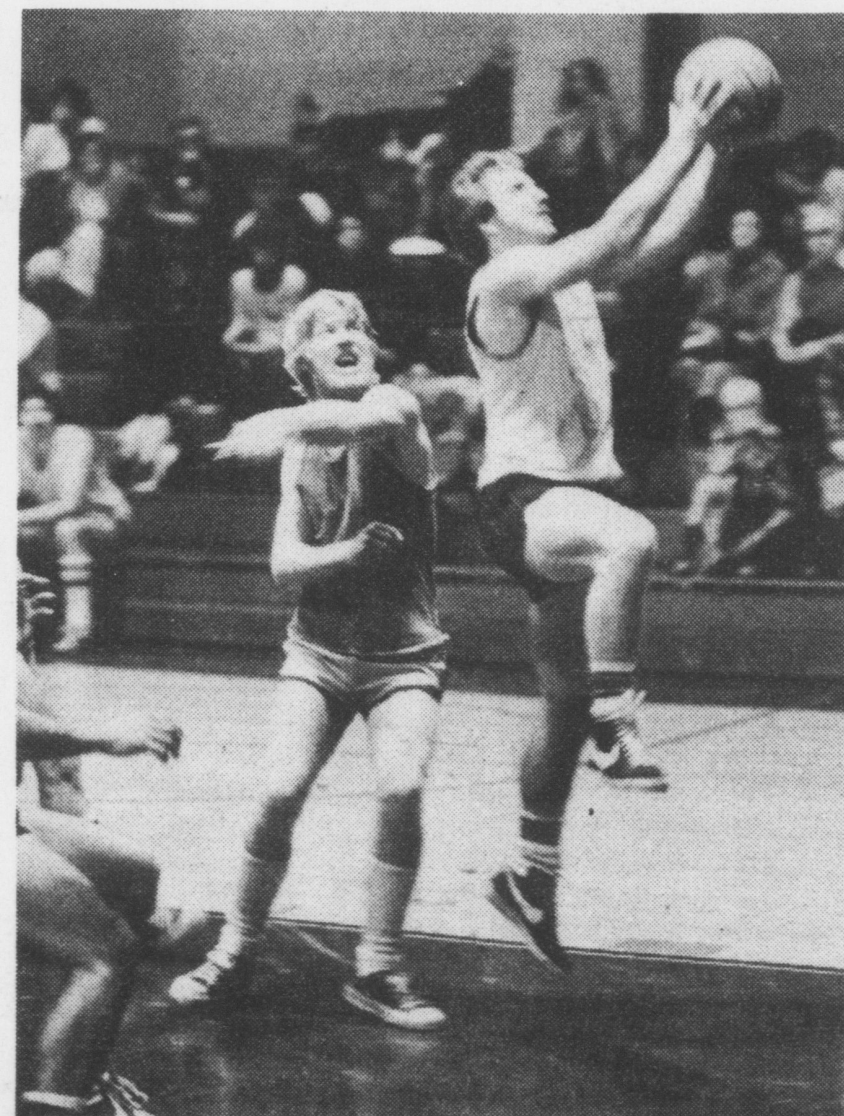
Indian plate was won by Herb Frey's lucky ticket stub.
