The Penn Museum in Harrisburg will present its traditional Holiday planetarium show, "The Star of Bethlehem," through December 31st this year.

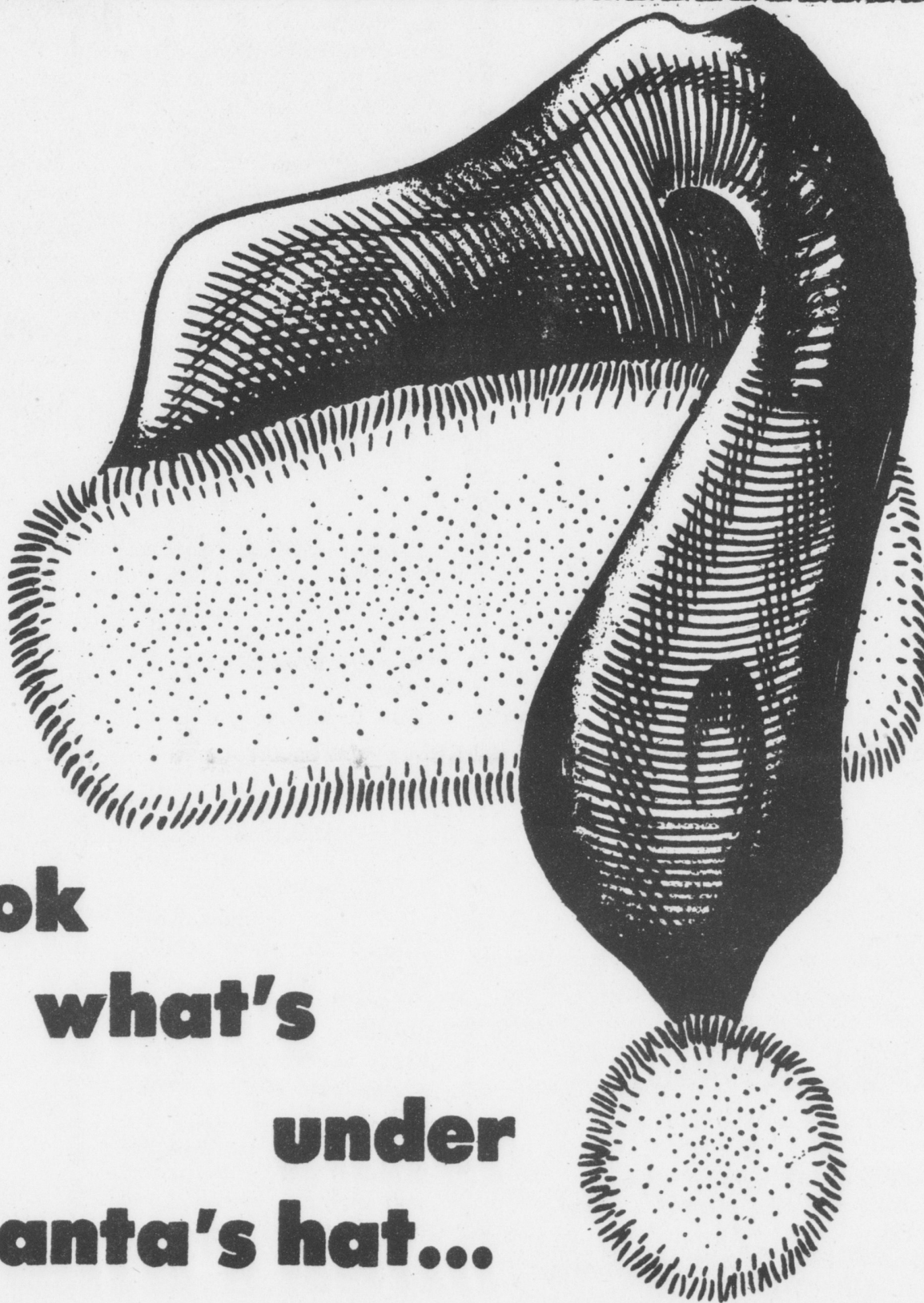
ious explanations for the star: miracle, rare astronomical event, or both.
