The Authority also received and discussed a proposal to change the water and sewer mains extension agreement to charge developers for the time of borough employees spent at the developer's site.

Work is progressing satisfactorily at the new water plant, according to Robert Stark, the engineer.

Engineers will look into the low water pressure along Bruce Avenue and report to the Authority in January.

Dwight Wolgemuth, of Oak Lane, has been hired to operate the new water treatment plant.

Salary increases were approved for Authority employees. The superin-

tendent's pay will increase by \$25 per week, and full time employees will get an extra \$20. All part time workers will receive \$2.85 per hour.

The Authority has, for the first time, spelled out the work week for their employees. The week will consist of 44 hours. The

Authority gave the employees their 10th holiday; the employee's birthday.

Frank Zink retired from the Authority after 20 years service to his community as a member. Mr. Zink, of Jones and Zink, Inc., is developer of Pennsbury Manor.

Should you care to attend any of these events, but have small children, it's all right: Nursery care is provided for all.

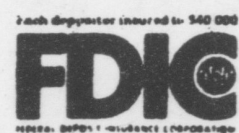
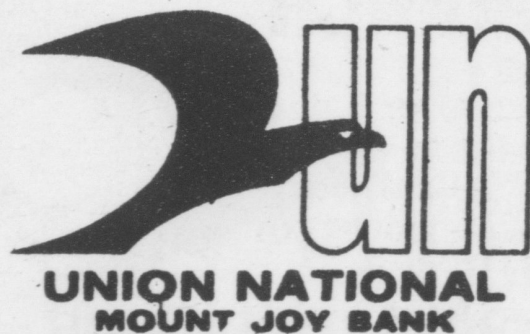
