The Musselman Mansion in Marietta (the big white house on the S-bend) has been bought by Mrs. Sally S. Cahalan, the new director of the James Buchanan Foundation for the Preservation of Wheatland.

Mrs. Cahalan was formerly assistant director of the Rosenbach Museum in Philadelphia. She has also been in similar positions with the Marlborough Art Gallery, the Knoedler Gal-

lery, and the Whitney Museum, all in New York, where she was also mayor John Lindsey's assistant and edited a weekly paper for the Foreign Trade Council.

She has studied at five colleges and universities, including the Sorbonne.

Mrs. Cahalan is involved in the restoration movement, and she and her husband plan to restore the Musselman Mansion.
