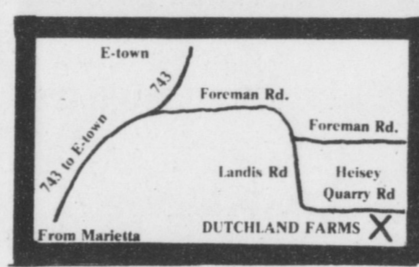
Larry is the first in his troop to receive both the God and Country and Eagle awards.
