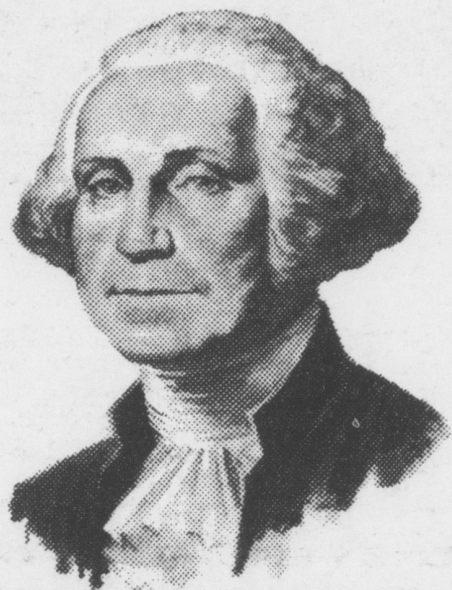

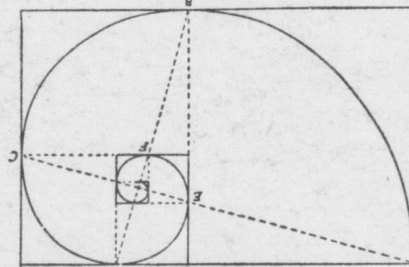
Stacy Miller

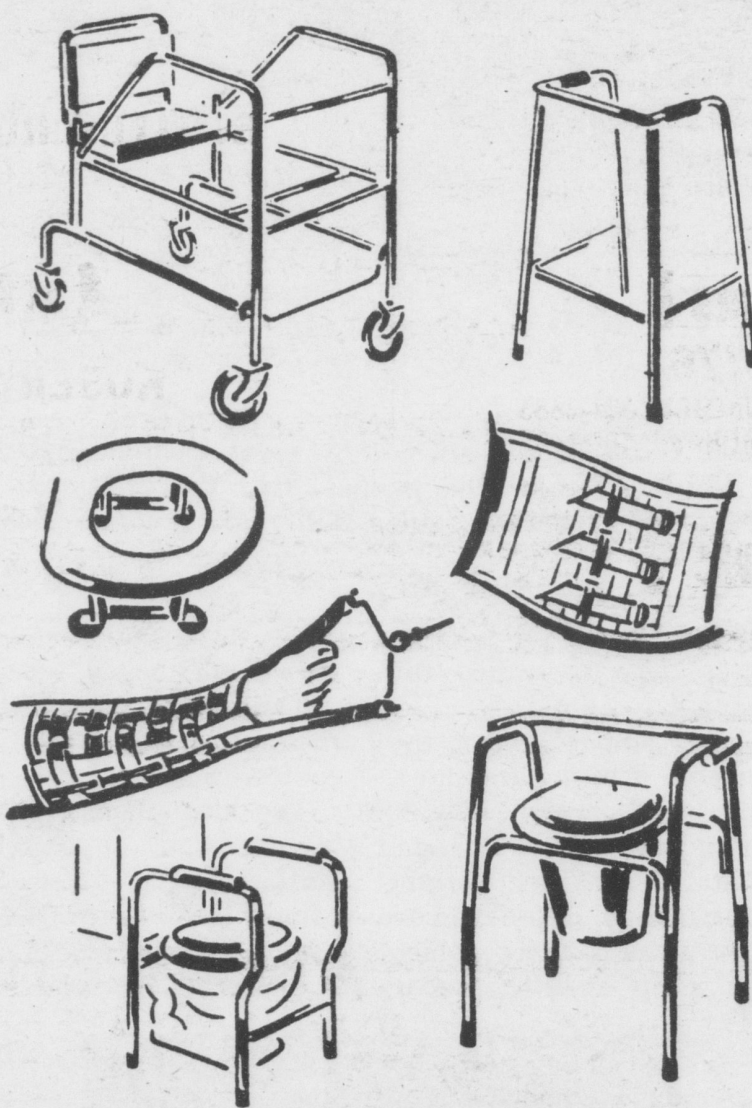
Stacy is in the academic course. She plans to major in accounting at E-town College.
