The 24-hour dance marathon netted \$3000 last year. Students are now signing up sponsors to contribute so much for every hour they dance.

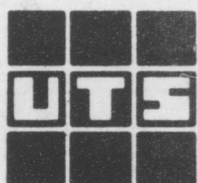
