They were married on January 14, 1928 by the

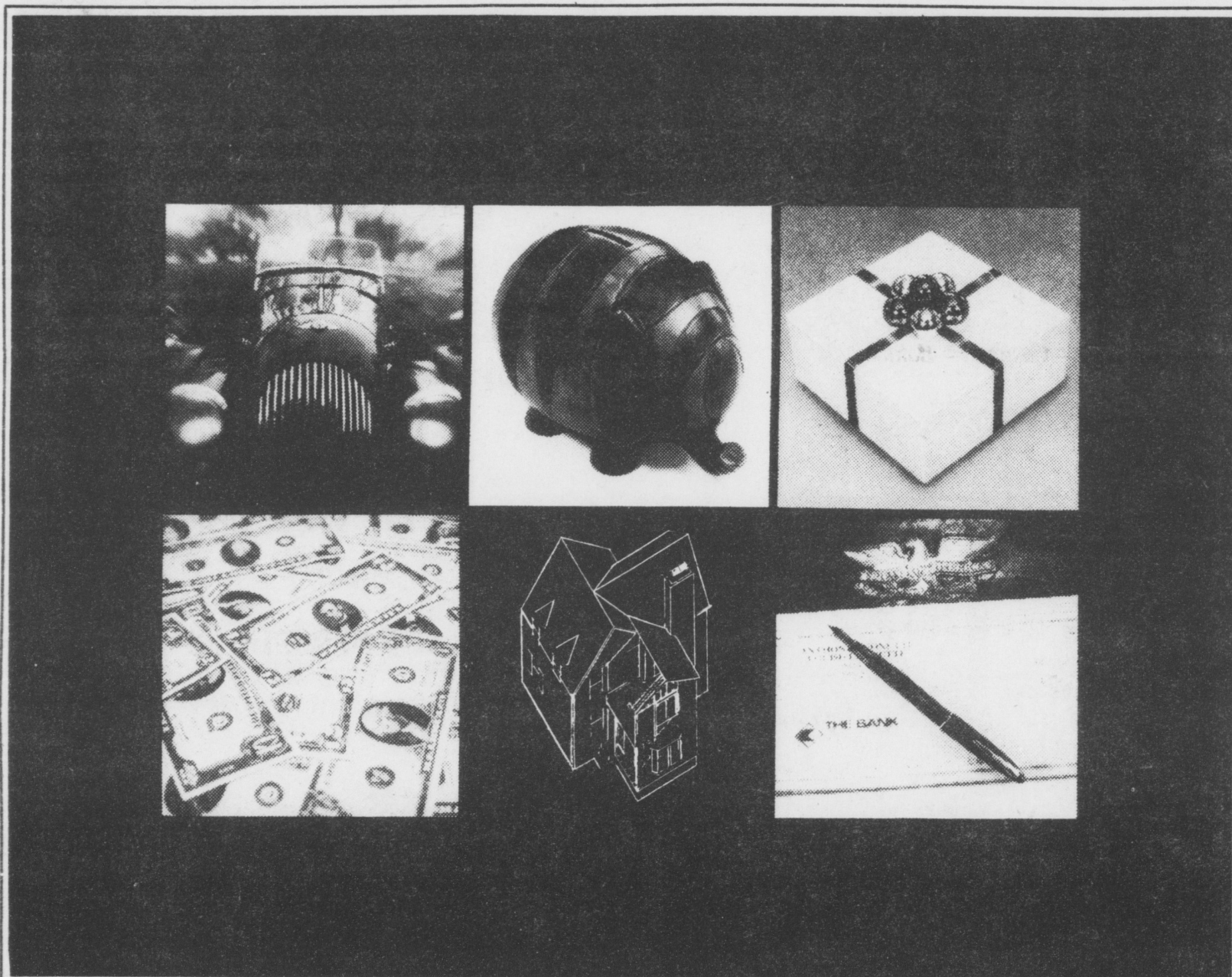

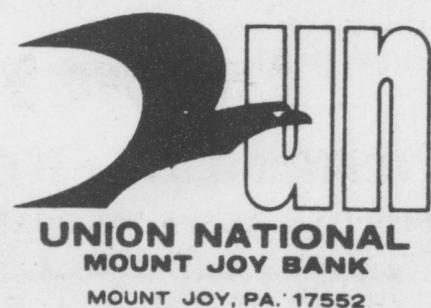
