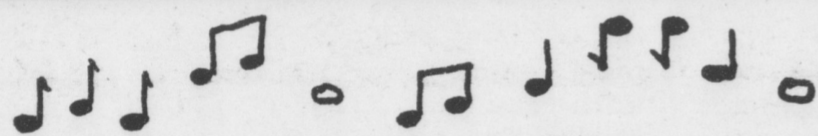

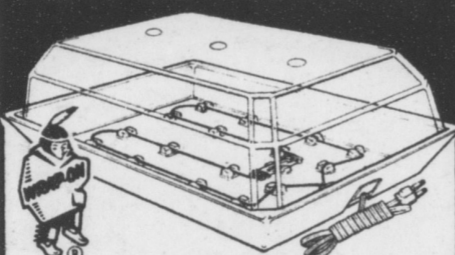

Barbara Kosco, a news broadcaster with WSBA radio, spoke to the Mount Joy BPW at their February meeting on the topic of "Women in Broadcasting."

Barbara talked about the mechanics of her business, and spoke at length on "Operation Snowflake," which WSBA provided during the big snowstorm. They relayed 2,400 messages, took 500 phone calls, and contributed 87 man-hours on January 17th. The news staff at WSBA consists of 8 people; the entire staff totals 16.

She said that, since women have only recently entered the broadcast news field, there are many

opportunities for qualified women.

The program was arranged by the BPW's foundation committee, chaired by Mrs. Ronald Hart. Mrs. George Broske led a group singing, and Mrs. Albert Wahlen offered the invocation.

Both Tammy and Candy are members of the Park City Skating Club, and are students of Mrs. Florence Cramer, an SRSTA professional.

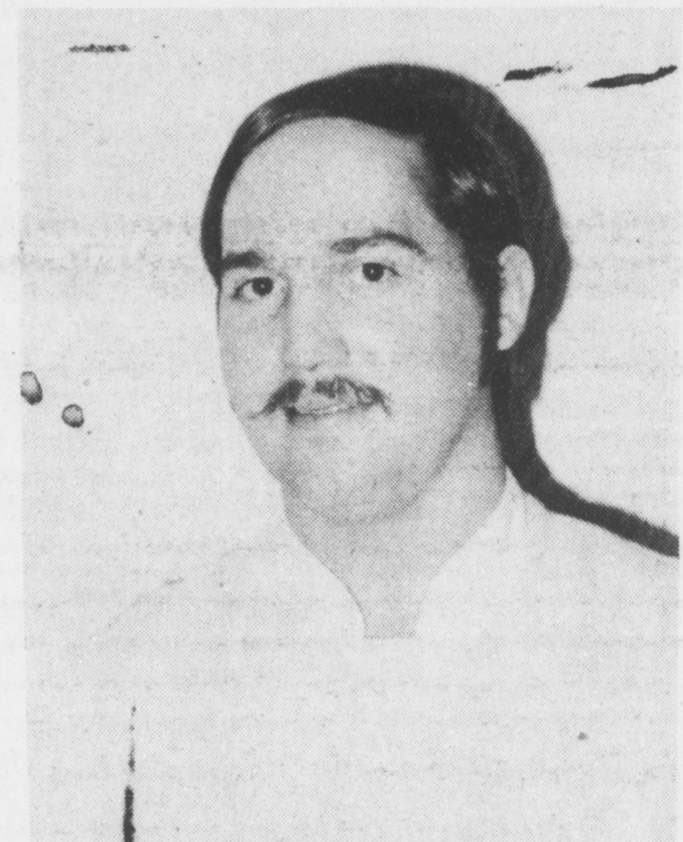
