Born in East Donegal Township, she was a daughter of the late Samuel

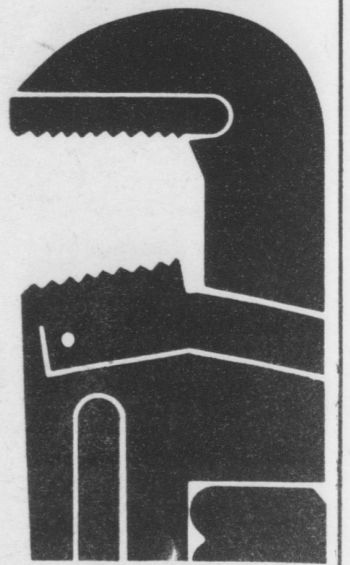
S. and Mary Reist Kraybill and the widow of Abner H. Risser, who died in 1971.
