Kindergarten registration soon

If your child will be at least five years old by September 6th, 1978, you can enroll him or her in kindergarten classes in one of the four Donegal School District elementary schools.

Take your child to the school nearest you on one of the following dates: April 11 to Grandview April 12 to Maytown School

April 13 to Riverview April 14 to Seiler School

Registration hours will be 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM. It is not necessary to bring your child to the school with you. What you should bring are a birth certificate and medical records of immunizations your child has received. These are

legally required before the school can enroll your child.

Your child must have had the following immunization shots: Diptheria, 3 shots of toxoid: Tetanus, 3 shots of toxoid; Polio, 3 doses of trivalent oral vaccine; Measles, one shot of vaccine or a doctor's

record of your child having had it; and Rubella [German Measles], one shot of vaccine.

If you want to enroll a child (who has never been to kindergarten) into the 1st grade, contact Gene Newcomer at the registration at the school nearest you. Any question you have will be answered there.


