Shelli Schwert, an 8th grade student at Beahm Jr. High, captured the spelling bee title in the 1978 Donegal School District spelling bee, held on Friday in the junior high auditorium. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Schwert of 281 Marietta Avenue in Mount Joy.

In the 14th round, runner-up Pam Greider missed the "i" in the word "ferocious." Shelli spelled the word correctly and then had to spell "foible" (a flaw or weakness) to become the champion. She earned her title by spelling the following words correctly: "deception," "garbage," "knowledge," "pickle," "sheriff," "reluctant," "anonymous," "bicentennial," "chlorine," "constitution," "demonstrate," "exaggerate," "emancipation," "fatigue," "ferocious," and "foible." Pam Greider, the runner-up, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Robert Greider of RD#1, Mount Joy. She is also an 8th grader at Beahm and will travel to

Lancaster with Shelli as an entrant in the Lancaster County Spelling Bee sponsored by the Lancaster Intell. In case one of the two girls can't make the bee in April, Grace Snyder will be the alternate. Grace is a seventh grader who lives on Snyder Road in Mount Joy with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Snyder.

Judges for the spelling bee were members of the English Department at Beahm. They were Miss Constance Ligenza, Mr. Anthony Ritrovato, and Mr. Lance Hardcastle. The announcer for the bee was Miss Catherine Zeller, chairman of the department.

The champion and runner-up were each given a new Webster dictionary while all contestants received a pen. The following
