Mount Joy Borough started cleaning its streets last Monday and will continue to April 19th. Signs will be posted in areas that are to be swept a day ahead of time.

Spring Cleanup will be held from April 24th to April 28th. During that week, free refuse pickup will be provided for all. The Borough asks that you keep in mind these guidelines:

1. Small items that can go into a twenty gallon trash can will be picked up by truck, and should be placed out like regular trash.

2. Larger items or those weighing over 50 pounds or made of heavy metal will be picked up separately. If you have some of these,

call the borough offices and leave your name, address and phone number before Friday, April 28th.

All articles should be placed at the curb.
