Get the facts!

- Fact:** Some air conditioners use more electricity than others to do the same cooling job
- Fact:** With electricity rates on the rise, electric operating costs are as important as purchase price
- Fact:** EER stands for Energy Efficiency Ratio and is a method of comparing electric operating costs of one air conditioner with another
- Fact:** The higher the EER number, the less electricity the unit will use. Look for an EER of 7.5 or better . . . 9 to 10 is considered very good.
- Fact:** Manufacturers are now required to display EER labels
- Fact:** An air conditioner that's too large in capacity can be as inefficient as one that's too small. Select the right size for your cooling needs

Just as economy-minded car buyers consider gasoline mileage, it makes sense for appliance buyers to consider "electricity mileage" before buying. Remember, the higher the EER number, the more energy efficient your air conditioner will be. But, consider this also . . . any place you can use a fan in place of an air conditioner, better yet. A fan operates on about 90% less electricity and also costs much less to buy.
