The Donegal Democratic Club held a meeting on Monday, April 24th, at the Marietta Community House.

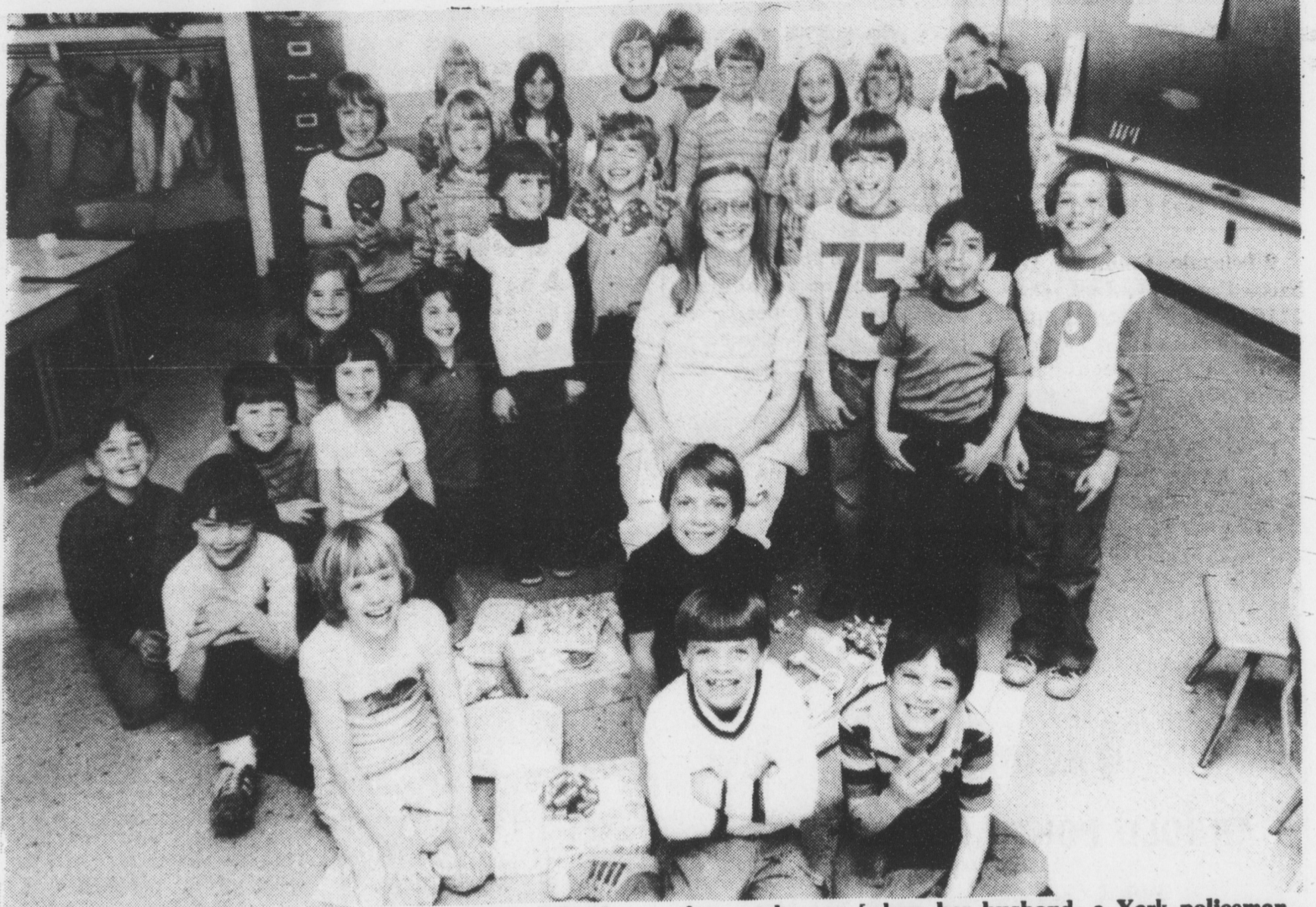
District leader John Matoney reported that write-in possibilities are still open for committee persons: 2 in the East Ward of Mount Joy, and one in the 1st District, Marietta.
