nominating committee consists of Mary Sheetz, Nellie Blake, and Ann Bell.

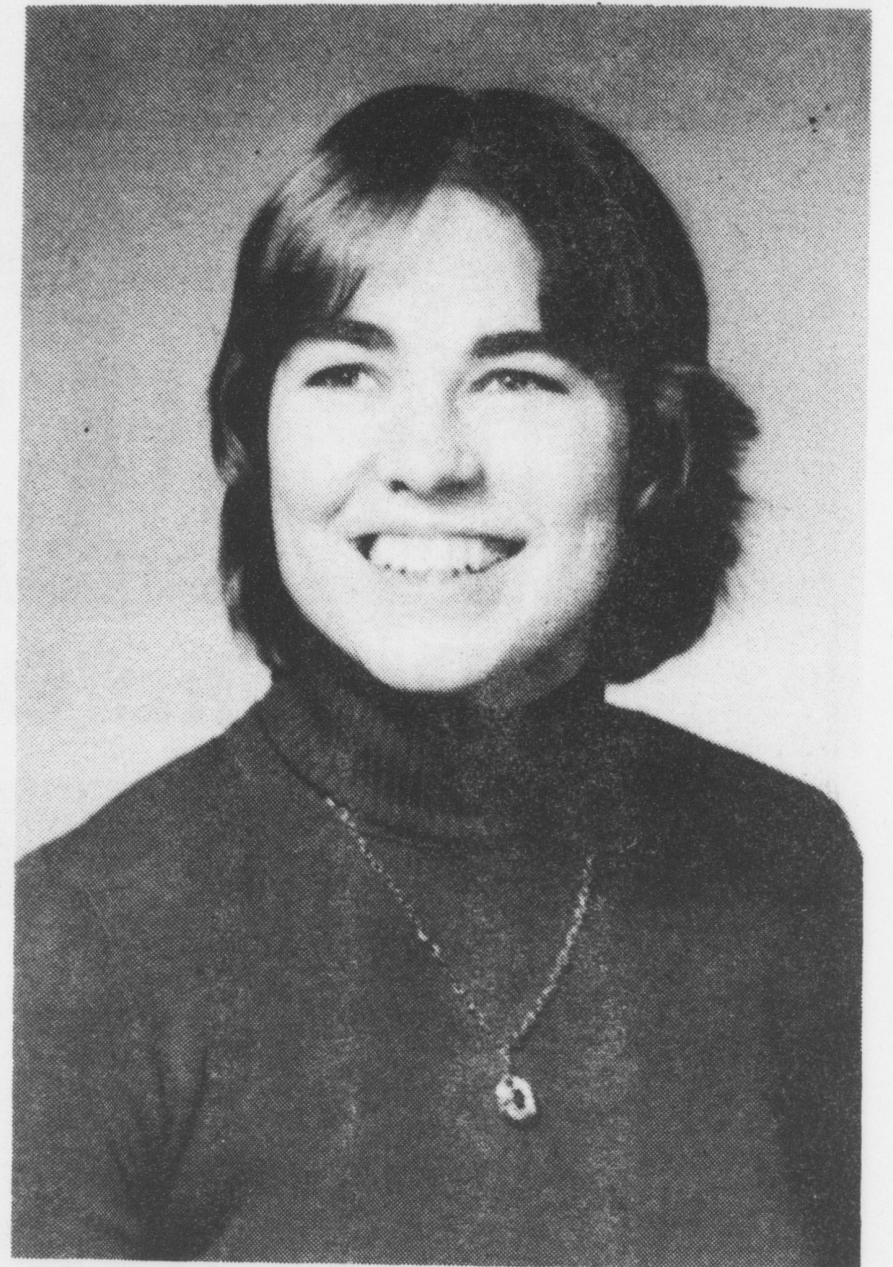
Helen Whealand, Ruth Eby and Elsie Lefever were appointed to the auditing committee. Margaret Brown accepted the responsibility for July events.

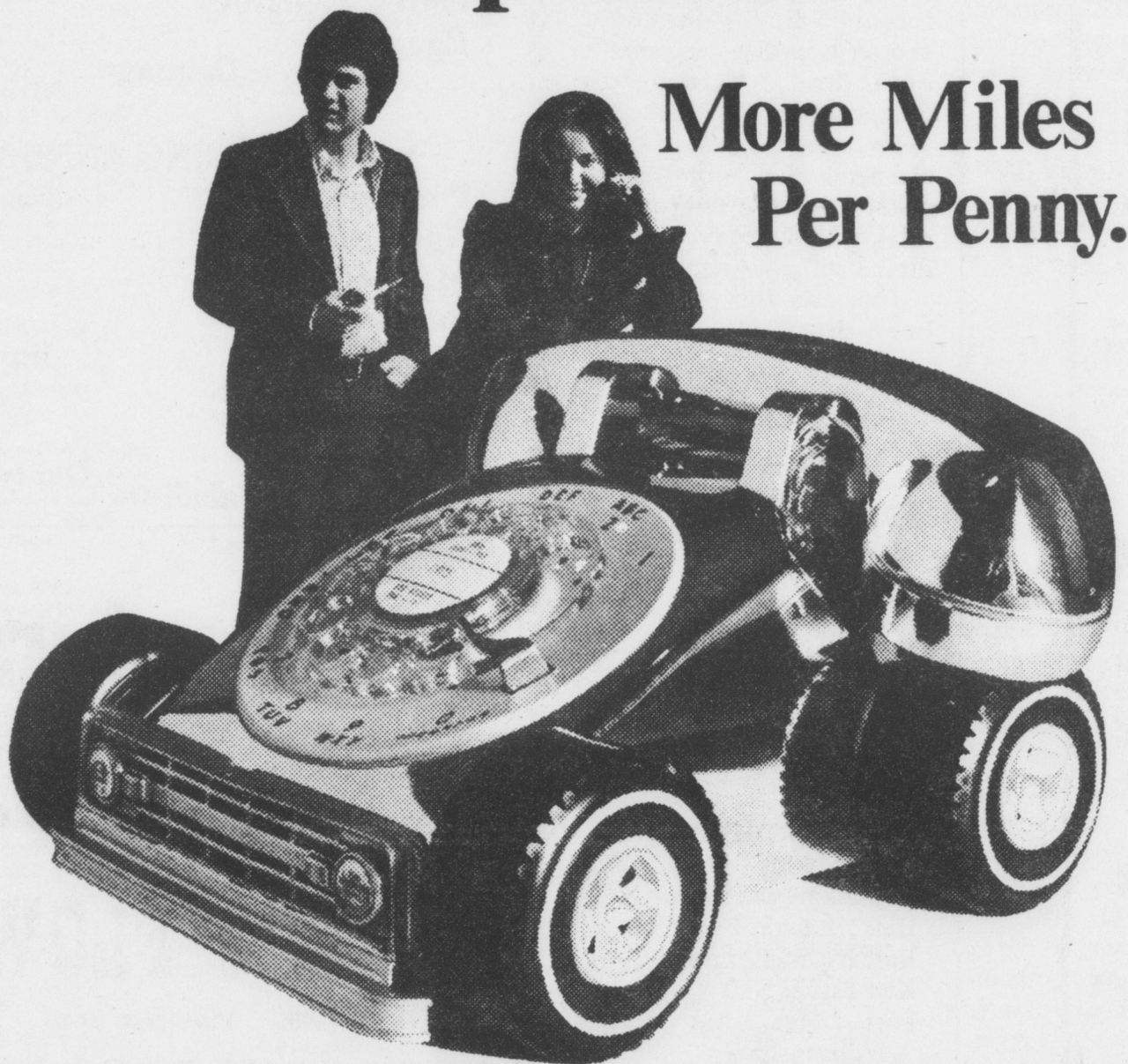

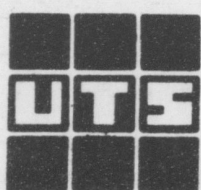
