The Olde Town Museum will be open for the three days of Memorial Day weekend—May 27th, 28th, and 29th—from 1:00 to 5:00 PM. This was announced by curators Mr.

The museum, at Waterford Avenue and West Walnut Street, Marietta, originally housed the borough offices and dungeon. It was built in 1847.

In the museum are displays of the original Borough Council chambers, a very old horse-drawn fire engine, and replicas of a country store, a river raft, and a one-room school.

There are many Civil War relics.

The town clock, also built in 1847, is made with wooden gears. It's bell was molded in London.
