Ecology course

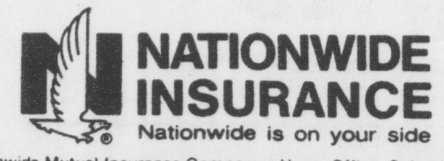

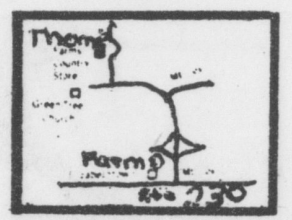
