The standings are: Sixers and Rookies, won one, lost none; Set-ups and Kings & Queens, won none, lost one.

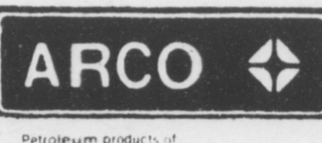

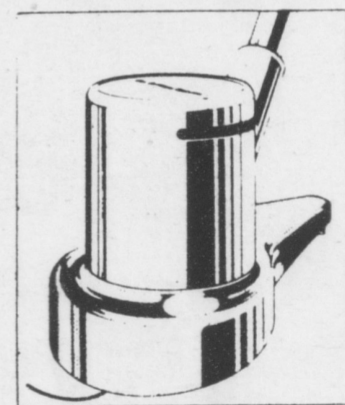
