All about bikes

How to buy the right bike can be an easily-solvthe smaller, local dealers who know what they're talking about and are more willing to help you than the employees of large, discount stores.

Another thing to look out for is a store with a good ed problem if you stick to service department. Make sure the dealer keeps a good stock of parts and ask him, specifically, how long a bike repair would take.

Ask a lot of questions about brakes, weight and

gears because these features generally change and improve with each new model a company produces.

The most important thing to take into account is height. When you straddle a bike you feet should rest flat on the floor. All other

features you can decide on with the help of the dealer.



Safety

It's important for a bike rider to remember that he is at a disadvantage on the road. He must look out for his own safety because car operators will often behave as though they don't see bicycles.

For this reason, lights on the bike and reflective lights strapped on your leg are a must for night cycling. For daytime visibility, buy the orange flag on a pole which attaches to the frame.

Cyclists are required by law to follow all the traffic laws that apply to motor vehicles. This includes riding on the right side of the road, stopping at stop signs and stop lights and yielding at yield signs, etc. Although adults usually follow the laws instinctively, children are atrocious law-breakers on their bikes. Parents should instruct children in laws applying to bicycles because it's a good way to improve bicycle

Although bikes can be dangerous on the road, they are a lot safer than they used to be. In 1935, for example, the number of bicycle-related deaths was 450, with about 3.5 million bikes on the road. In 1976 the number of deaths had doubled to 900, but the number of bikes on the road had grown 27 times to 95 million. So the death rate in 1976 in one-thirteenth what it was in 1935.


What's new


it's the flashy sportscar of the bike world.
