PP&L sponsors wildlife talks

Management of waterfowl resources will be the subject of a talk and slide presentation at the Pequea Creek Campground at Lake Aldred Friday (July 21).

Charlie Strouphar, waterfowl management assistant with the Pennsylvania Game Commission, will present the program at 8:30 PM.

There is no admission charge and the program is open to the public, said Ben Moyer, seasonal naturalist at Lake Aldred. Since the program will be held outdoors, participants should bring chairs or blankets for seating.

Included in the program will be discussion of Canada geese, providing information on their habits; the problems they cause when they appear in large numbers and what is being done about them in waterfowl management.

Strouphar also will discuss the Middle Creek Wildlife Management Area north of Lancaster which was created by the Game Commission as a stopover point for migrating waterfowl.

Pequea Creek Campground is located off Route 324 near the village of Pequea. Lake Aldred is operated by Pennsylvania Power & Light Co. in

conjunction with its Holtwood Hydroelectric generating station.
