Two Mount Joy men were on the dean's list for the spring term at Penn State's University Park campus. They are:

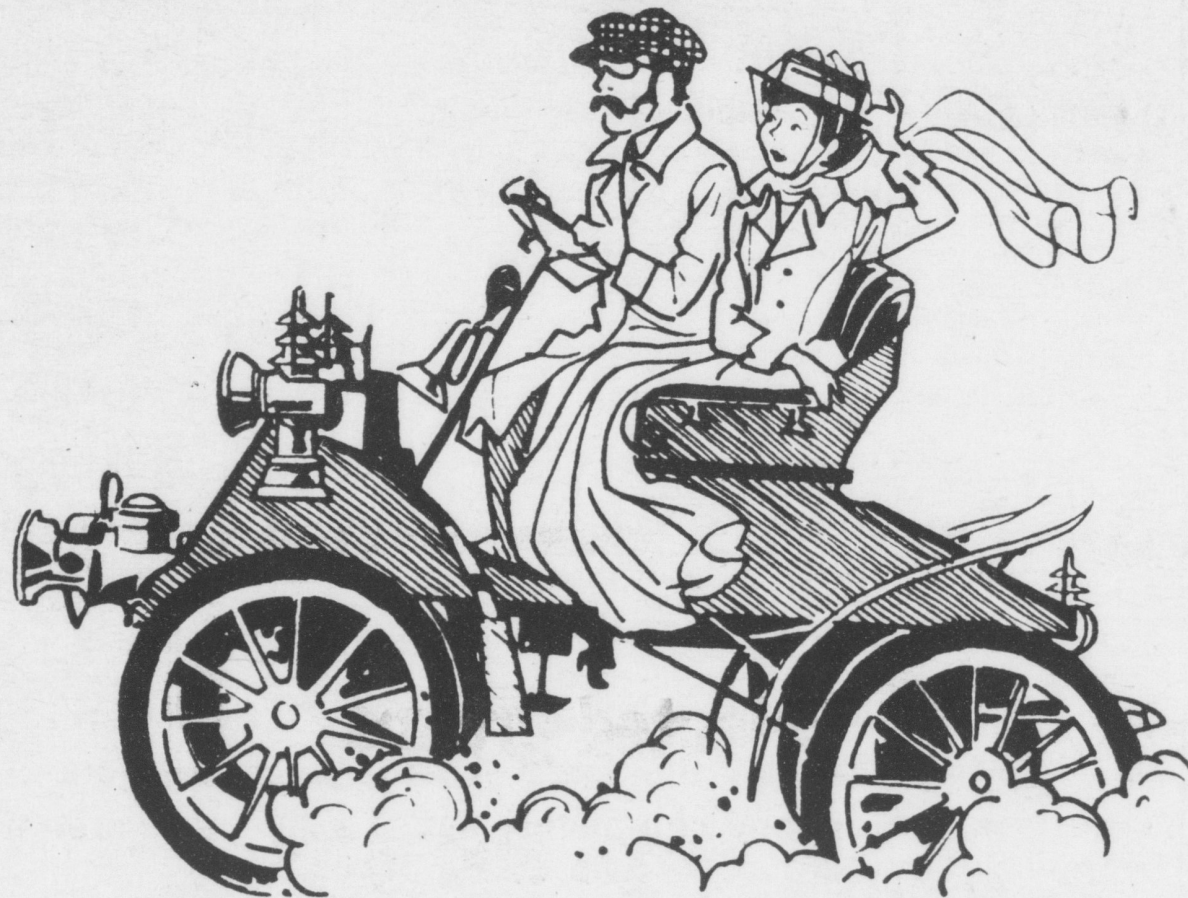

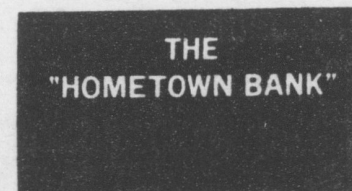
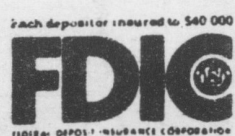
