Rosetta L. Smith, 71, of 376 E. Front Street, Marietta, died Wednesday at Columbia Hospital after an illness of a year.

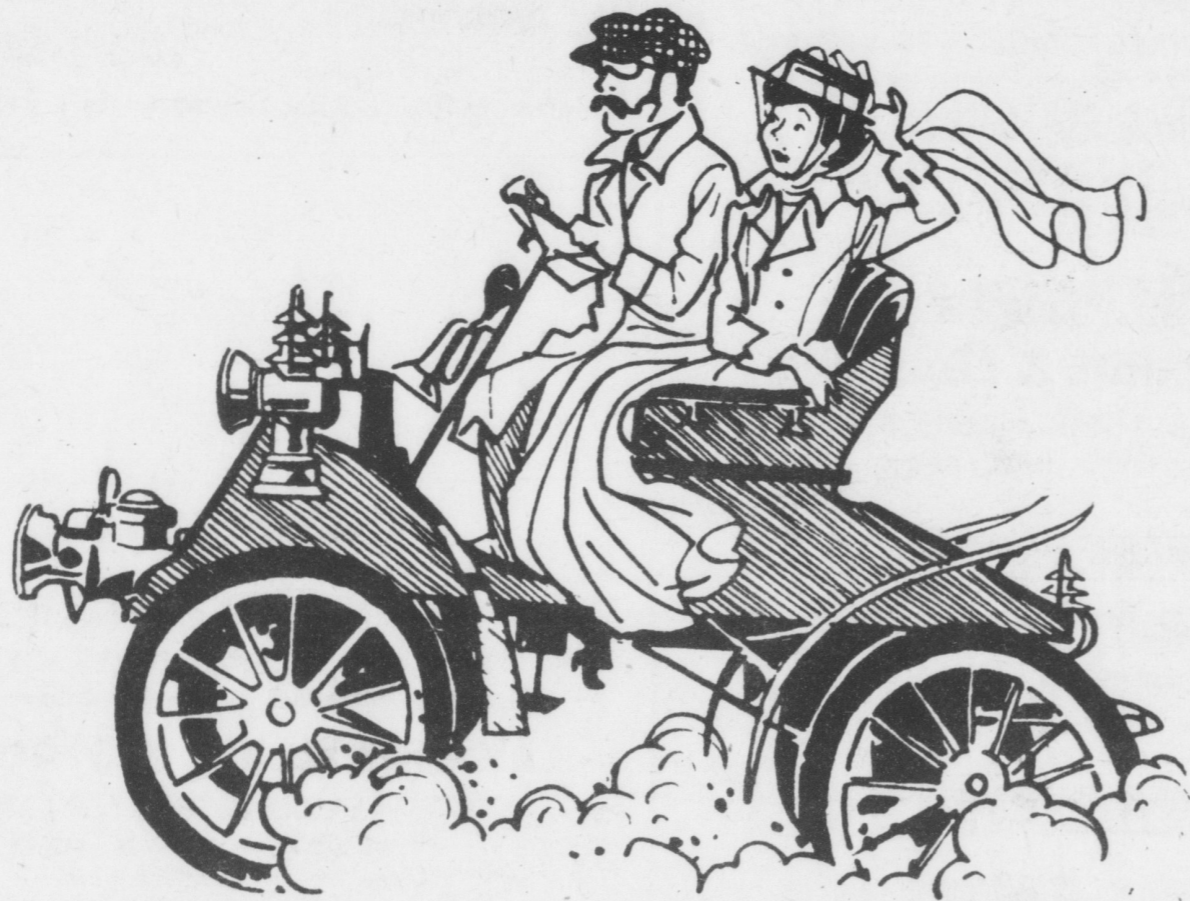
She was the widow of Paul E. Smith, who died in 1969.

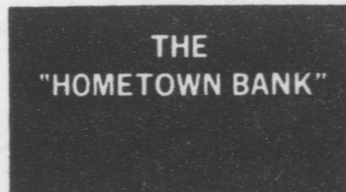
