On the outskirts of Baltimore they asked directions of a cab driver, who gave them a bum steer. In desperation, Gary saw some Baltimore city police and asked them to help. The Baltimore police

provided an escort and took them, sirens screeching and through red lights directly to the hospital. It was 8:40, ten minutes late.

They were not too late, however. By 11 o'clock tests had established that the boy's kidney was compatible to Dick's body. He had to go on the kidney machine before the operation. At 5 a.m. the operation commenced. It continued until 11 a.m. Dick had a new kidney.

In five weeks he was back in Mount Joy.

Dick and Betty have joined the Lancaster County Kidney Association, a group of about 40 people who help each other and other people with kidney problems. They help in locating transplants and kidney machines. Dick and Betty believe that anyone with kidney problems could be helped by getting in touch with the Association.

Discuss the proposed projects for the summer of 1979 and develop a priority list.

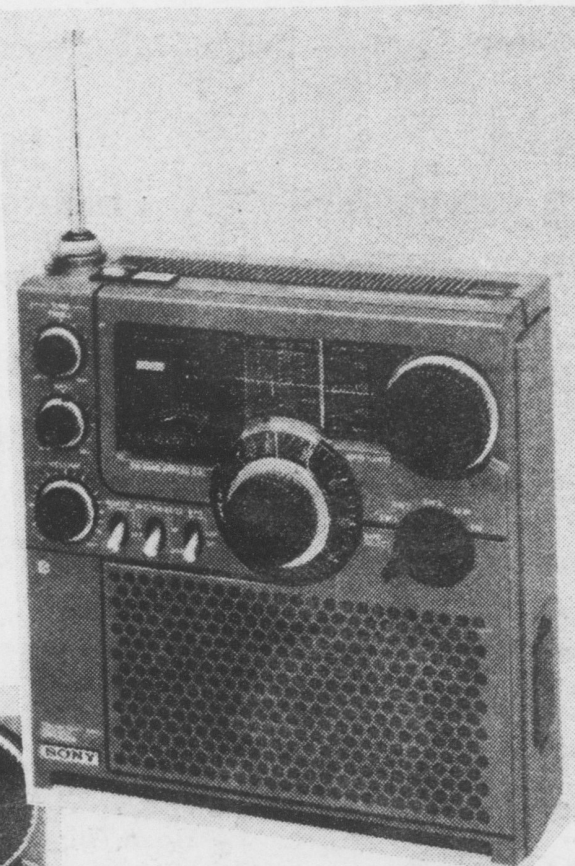
Announce the budget schedule for the preparation of the 1979 budget.

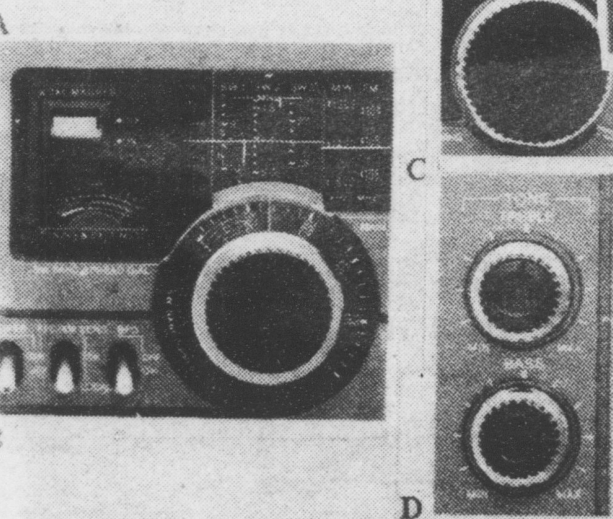
