Gayle (Mrs. Morris) O'Hern, formerly of Bainbridge, and her 12-year-old daughter Jill came through Maytown on Mrs. O'Hern's first trip back East in 16 years. Mrs. O'Hern got to visit many relatives, and Jill got to see Chocolate World and row houses in Lancaster, which amazed her. Jill also sampled shoe

fly pie, but she found that she prefers pumpkin pie.

Jill, a member of the Pueblo tribe, was adopted at the age of 2 months. She has a brother, also adopted, who is white. His name is John, and he is 17.

Jill was also impressed by Park City, the large trees that grow here, and the Amish, whom she thought "neat."

Before this trip, Jill had never been on a bus, train, or airplane (she liked the airplane best). She is more

familiar with horses than most Easterners, though. The O'Herns live on a 488 acre ranch, and own several horses. They raise cattle, soybeans, wheat and hogs.

The farm, Mr. O'Hern's family spread, is located near Mounds, OK. Mrs. O'Hern (her first name is Gayle) met her husband, who is 1/4 Indian, in California, when he was in the Navy.

Mr. O'Hern is a member of the Uaychie (pronounced "you-chee") tribe.
