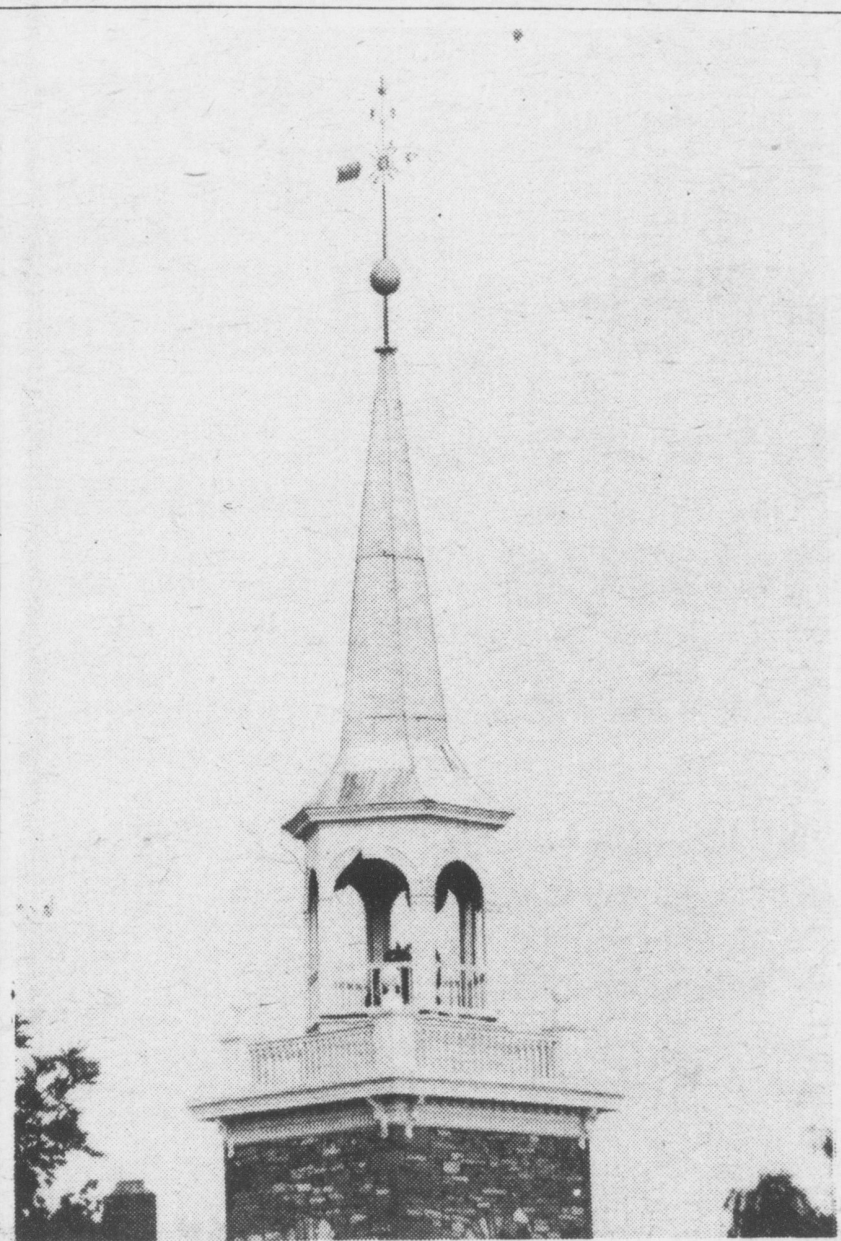
"That's a very good rate," she commented.

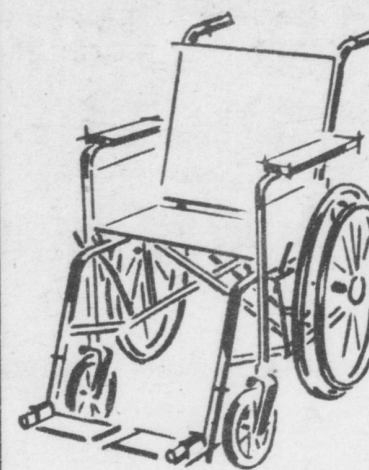
