### DHS students get inside story on local jobs

Some Donegal High students are getting in-depth job counseling this month. They're interviewing people who work in local businesses.

Members of the clerical office practice class developed a questionnaire and then got an individual, who is working in a field the student might want to enter, to fill it out and answer questions about his or her job.
