#### Timely tips: sheets

New sheet styling takes its inspiration from a variety of sources, including other cultures and crafts, native clothing, Impressionist paintings, contemporary fashiion trends,

and graphic art.

No one design dominates, but there is a movement of less hardedged styling. One example is the softer, less obviously defined styling in florals and landscapes.

Colors are bright, and are pared with white or neutrals such as camel or bone. Subdued and muted pales have replaced lackluster pastels. The new styling trends include:

\*Peasantries. Overall floral and paisley sheet designs have been translated from the floral designs of challis fabrics and scarves.

\*Ethnic Derivatives. A variety of sheet designs are inspired by wooden block prints, primitive drawings, Oriental kimonos, and colorful native paintings. Styles are updated with more sophisticated colorings and contemporary scale and design.

\*Stylized Florals. Florals are less true to nature, softer, more linear, and less romanticized.

\*Impressionism. Stylists have borrowed freely or improvised on 19th Century art forms. Some styles reflect color and brush strokes true to the period, whild others are contemporary takeoffs because of their bright colorings and more geometric feeling.


