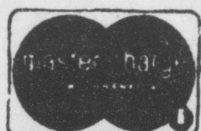

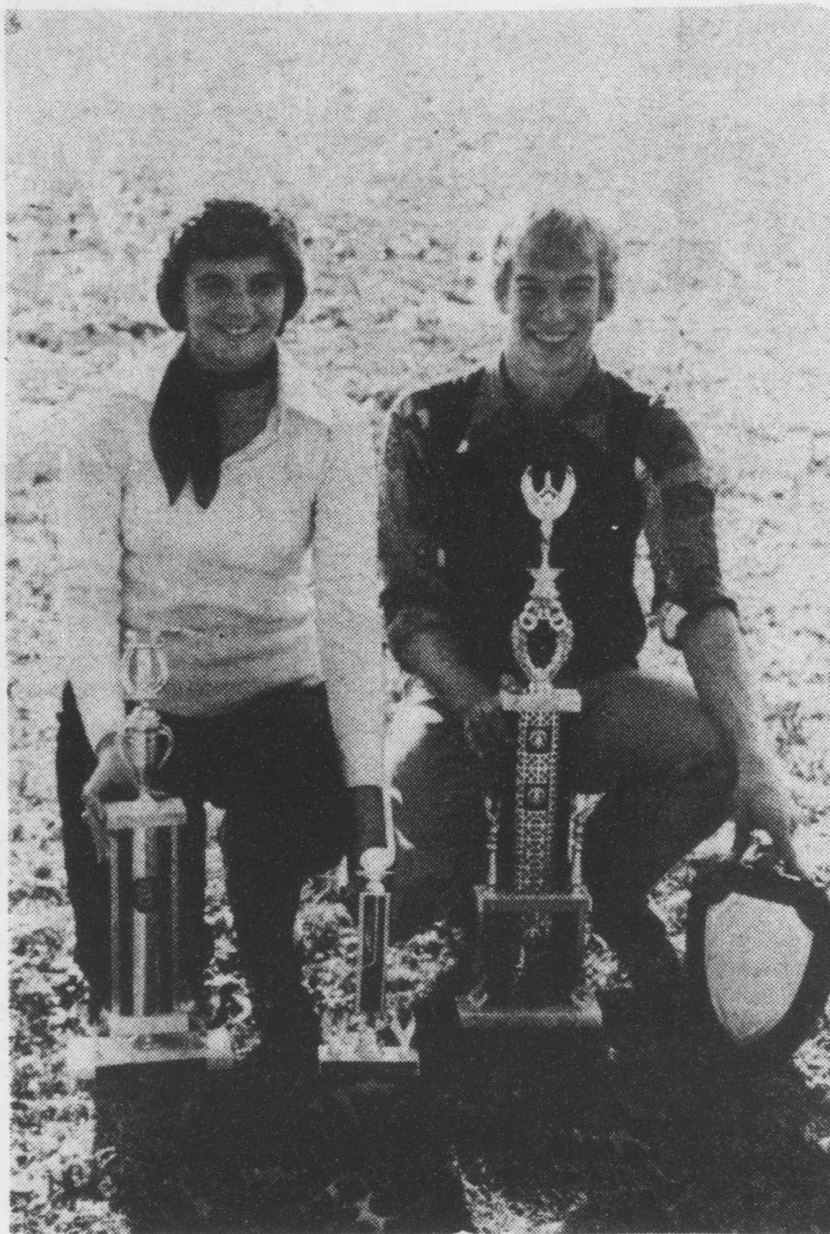

Pack 136 of Mount Joy went on a hike to Governor's Stables. Attending were: leaders Robert Mark,

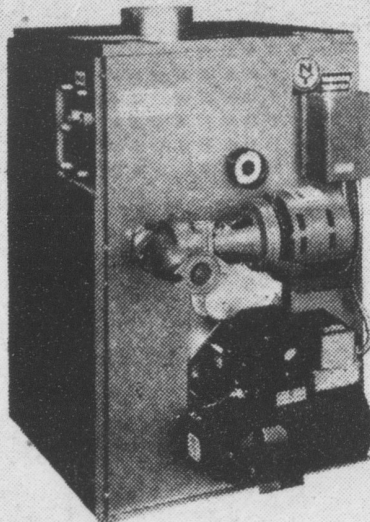

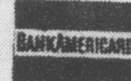
